

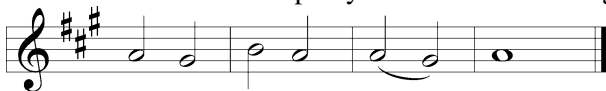

 The Building Account: \$3.00

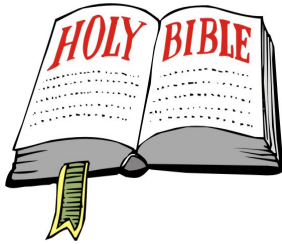
