

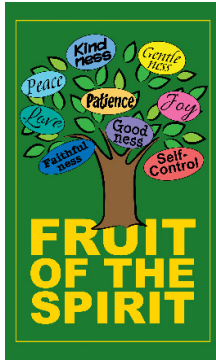

SERIES THEME: The Fruit of the Spirit

The services from The Baptism of Our Lord (January 8) through Transfiguration (February 26) are tied together by the theme “The Fruit of the Spirit” from Galatians 5:22–23. Each Sunday focuses on a different fruit.

THEME CELEBRATION “Gentleness and Self-Control” Galatians 5:23; 1 Peter 3:16; 2 Peter 1:5–6

The final two items on the list of the fruit of the Spirit that Paul writes of to the Galatian Christians are gentleness and self-control. In a certain way, they are complementary. Peter speaks of sharing the hope that is ours in Christ with gentleness and later instructs his readers to “supplement your faith with . . . self-control.” The same qualities that mark the Spirit working through the child of God are as central to the vibrant life of faith in the twenty-first century as they were in the first century.

The list of the fruit of the Spirit contains nine distinct evidences of the working of God through individual Christians for the benefit not only of themselves but for the community of faith of which they are a part and the community in which they live.

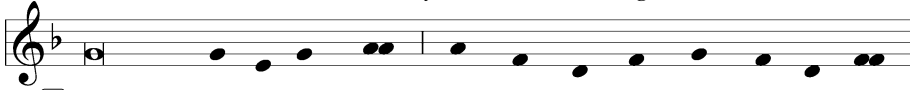

IN REGARD TO HOLY COMMUNION: According to Scripture, Holy Communion should be celebrated by those who are: **United in a common faith** (1 Cor. 10:16-17, 21-22; Rom. 16:17); **Repentant of sins** (1 Cor. 5:11, Matt. 18:17-18); **Able to examine their lives** (1 Cor. 11:27-29); and believe that in this precious meal they **receive the true body and blood of Jesus** given and shed for the forgiveness of their sins (Luke 22:19-22).

Since Scripture teaches that those people who do not fully understand the meaning of this meal eat and drink to their own harm (1Cor. 11:27-29), and because the Lord's Supper is the

supreme act of stating our unity in faith and doctrine, we would ask those people who are visiting with us to **please speak with our Pastor**, preferably prior to the day of worship, in order that we might fulfill our responsibility of properly instructing people in the right use of the precious Sacrament.

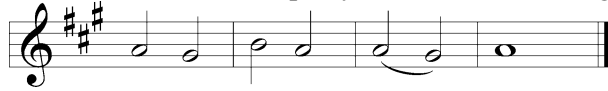
