

SERIES THEME: The Fruit of the Spirit

The services from The Baptism of Our Lord (January 8) through Transfiguration (February 26) are tied together by the theme "The Fruit of the Spirit" from Galatians 5:22–23. Each Sunday focuses on a different fruit.

THEME CELEBRATION "Kindness" *Proverbs 31:26*; *21:21* In describing the woman who fears the Lord and is a blessing to those around her, Proverbs says, "She opens her mouth with wisdom, and the teaching of kindness is on her tongue." This wisdom reminds us that kindness is a fruit of the Spirit that benefits from cultivation. Finding ways to be kind is a lifelong occupation.

Also in Proverbs, we read this word that includes a divine promise, "Whoever pursues righteousness and kindness will find life, righteousness, and honor." We add kindness to the list of the fruit of the Spirit and sing of the benefit that it can bring.







From there you will cruise down the Amsterdam Canal going to Cologne and Koblenz, through the Rhine Gorge and on to Worms, Heidelberg and Speyer. Then it will be on to Eisnach, Erfurt, Wisleben and Wittenberg and finally to Berlin before departing for the USA.

As you enjoy the beautiful stone castles and churches, Rev. Keith Loesch, the founder and past director of the Wittenberg English Ministry in Germany, will be there to interpret the paintings and explain the artistry of the medieval artists and the history of Martin Luther's life.
