



SERIES THEME: The Fruit of the Spirit

The services from The Baptism of Our Lord (January 8) through Transfiguration (February 26) are tied together by the theme “The Fruit of the Spirit” from Galatians 5:22–23. Each Sunday focuses on a different fruit.

THEME CELEBRATION “Joy” *John 15:11; 1 Thessalonians 1:6*

The message that Jesus shared with His disciples had one special benefit. It brought them joy. As He conversed with His disciples, our Lord said, “These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.”

Included in Paul’s list of the fruit of the Spirit is joy. In writing to the Thessalonian Christians, Paul recalls that they “received the word . . . with the joy of the Holy Spirit.”
