

#### **SERIES THEME: The Fruit of the Spirit**

The services from The Baptism of Our Lord (January 8) through Transfiguration (February 26) are tied together by the theme "The Fruit of the Spirit" from Galatians 5:22–23. Each Sunday focuses on a different fruit.

**THEME CELEBRATION** "Peace" 2 Thessalonians 3:16; Numbers 6:26 In concluding 2 Thessalonians, Paul has special words of benediction: "Now may the Lord of peace Himself give you peace at all times in every way. The Lord be with you." For God's people, peace has always been a focus of prayer and of living. To live with a sense of inner peace is the greatest of blessings.

The final word we hear in the Benediction is "peace" as the blessing spoken by Aaron over the children of Israel is recited.







**Thank you for your continued gifts to our Building Fund** – We thank you for your gifts last Sunday to the Building Fund of \$1,505.00. The gifts were designated as follows:
