


## "Out Of The Boat"



Greetings to you in the Ascended Savior, Christ Jesus our Lord.

Very rarely do you get a noble project in which everyone is on board. Every project has pro/con supporters. An oil refinery

in Union County, a Civic Center in Sioux Falls, ethanol production, a road to Falls Park in Sioux Falls, yes, curb and gutter in Pierre.

It's also true in the life of the Church: Our 1978 addition "how can we do this when we still have debt on the 1961 church"; our 1996 Sanctuary, "why do we need a new Sanctuary? People should just come earlier to get a seat, then they wouldn't have to sit in the Fellowship Hall"; our 2009 Christian Family Life Center, "Why do we need more room for Fellowship, and why does the Center need high ceilings?"

Well. Progress never comes easily. So we are very grateful that 73% of our family units are involved in supporting this project financially. We are told that if you have 60% support you are doing well.

We have a margin to close, so here is our hope:

- That the 73% who are already involved will meet or exceed their proposed giving.
- ◆ That the remaining 27% will also be a part of helping us financially. Why? Well, two really important reasons:
  - 1. We honestly need the extra financial support
  - 2. Secondly, and this is actually the more im-

portant one, is that when we are done the joy will be completely shared with all of us. Everyone will have had a hand. We call that "everyone being franchised."

That is why we have encouraged all of our children to give. They will truly grow up in the Christian Family Life Center. Many will stay and return to Pierre to raise their own family.

"Kids Building the Kingdom" brings us to the struggles of progress discussed earlier in this Pastoral reflection.

The Lego church is somewhat of a parallel to what happens in real life. While many youth were placing Legos and raising the church up, some Sundays the progress went backwards as some took down what others had created or some sought to rearrange what others had done. We especially notice that the cross that had started to form was actually taken out of the way.

It was an interesting parallel not just to our Building project or building projects in general, but to the role of the Holy Christian Church in a changing society. The changing culture of our society is not just lukewarm sometimes but openly hostile toward Christ and His Holy Church.

So we must press on, not just with Building our Christian Family Life Center, but with our clear witness in this, somewhat at times, dark landscape we live in.

We do this not only in speech, but in our loving deeds in this community and by supporting mission efforts in other parts of our state, country and world where we cannot be. Yes, while we build here we must still build Christ's Kingdom in the world.

So, on with our noble task in Christ, may we and the building we are "Building Together in Faith" serve our community lovingly and well.

Thank you for all everyone of you is doing! God bless you richly and as always, "The Lord be with vou."

The new Habitat build is one we made a commitment to.


