Hello Christian Friends,

Last month I highlighted some ways for families to increase God talk in the homes and I hope you have begun to work on some of those practices, and hopefully have found it rewarding and not as difficult as maybe you thought it might be. This month I do want to just again emphasize what Faith Lutheran is hoping to do to assist you in passing on the Faith to your children. The primary programs we have for those under high school are Midweek and Sunday School. These programs and designed to work together to support faith development and to also bring kids of the same age and life experience together for faith exploration.

Faith Lutheran believes that both programs are essential and do not view them as either or, but a both and. While they differ in some manner of focus, stories from the Bible, and catechism teachings, they both together work for faith formation by looking at God's word and teaching and applying them to life, in conjunction with the application that you are also doing at home. If you have questions about this, or suggestions for how we can do better, please let us know.

These two programs do by there very nature, although our teachers work hard to teach all aspects of our faith life, do tend to focus on helping kids to grow in knowledge. We rely heavily on parents to help in developing attitudes of the heart, relationship with God and others, etc. Knowledge is only a component of our faith, but hopefully what we teach can be of assistance in other areas.

I want to give you an important passage from Hebrews that directs a lot of what we do, "Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another--and all the more as you see the Day approaching." I hope that as we meet regularly with worship, kids in Sunday School and Midweek, adults in Bible Study, and

other activities, and events for the whole family that we might be encouraged in our faith and drawn closer to Christ.

Bricks and Blocks

As you read our October newsletter there is a pretty good chance the masonry crew is close to completion. It's been enjoyable watching them work. They have worked with five different block and brick elements.

- The concrete blocks were of two dimensions. The 12" block was laid in heavy load bearing walls, for example, the gym is all in 12" block. There was 8" block on the balance of the walls.
- The lighter dress block is called a split face block and the color was "Seashell". The trim around the windows where the split face block is placed is called a burnished block and it is smooth.
- Finally, the brick which match the front wall of the '96 sanctuary is a "Buckwheat Maple". Now that's a quite a name, however, chewing into one of those bricks would not be a healthy breakfast.
- Our masonry crew was from
 Fichter-Davey Masonry.
 Randy Davey, one of the owners, was on site most days as
 the project manager for the
 masonry work and also made a
 special point to join us for the
 Dedication of the Cornerstone,
 for which we thank him.
- We thank Brad & Laurie Schultz for donating the cornerstone.
- As you receive this October

Newsletter the "Cross" wall is probably done. It's our signature wall and it's very beautiful.

- The entire brick and block work is nearing completion.
- The Cornerstone has been laid and Dedicated.
- The roof will be all in by the end of October if not before.

As you can see, work started on the Garden on Wednesday the 23rd

of September. Steve Bontje, one of our newest members, is doing the work on this Garden and expects to be completed around October 1st. Steve was able to salvage the sod from the area and that sod has been placed in the Daycare play area. We have continued to receive some donations for the completion of this Garden and as of this week we are very close to having all of the funds needed to complete the Garden. In the last couple of weeks we received donations for all 3 benches, a generous memorial gift for the retaining wall and many other gifts to help complete the project. We are sincerely thankful to everyone who has given to this project. We believe that this Garden will be a wonderful tribute to Pastor Urbach and his family for the 35 years the Lord has allowed him to be in our midst. We are hopeful that this can be a peaceful, pleasant setting for people to come and reflect on memories of loved ones and talk to the Lord or just enjoy the surroundings. We hope to have a Dedication of this area to the Glory of God yet this fall.

We are still working on the possibility of having the names of friends or loved ones engraved in stone and placed in the area below the retaining wall. This possibility requires some serious discussion and thought as to how we would go about this and we would have a set procedure that would need to be adopted by the Board of Stewardship before this opportunity would be presented.
