So here is a plan, turn off the T.V., put down the newspaper, set the cellphone on silence and invest 5 minutes in your family with these simple steps.

Share-discuss your highs and lows of the day.
Some places use the pattern of Joys,
Junk, and Jesus, which I kind of like, but
the Jesus part comes at step 3. What
are the joys of the day, what things were
low or junky.

Read-Look at and highlight a verse of scripture in your Bible. You can use a devotional book like portals of prayer, or use some other tool. All you need is a verse to get you thinking about what God says to us.

Talk-Something we don't do enough of, how does the Bible verse, or God's word relate to our lives, to our highs and lows, How does Jesus impact our Joys and our Junk

Pray-pray about your days, your joys and you junk, pray for your family, and the world. Bless one another-This can be however your family does it. Maybe you say God bless you, or Jesus loves you and I do to. Maybe you hug one another.

Use these 5 steps. The "Faith Five" and bless your home and your family with the strengthening of faith and relationships with God and one another for generations to come. God bless you and I look forward to walking with your families this year and teaching about the love of Christ for us.

EVERLASTING MELODY



My heart sings a melody, an everlasting melody,
A tune of love, a song of peace,
An anthem that sets me free.
Just when I think there's no song to sing,
I hear a melody that is everlasting.
Everlasting melody!

In musical terms, a melody is a sequence of (mostly) pleasing sounds; a tune or a song. It is also the leading part of a harmonic composition. In a choral work, the melody is most often sung by the sopranos, but sometimes appears in the other voices as well. In instrumental compositions, the melody can surface from any of the woodwind, string or brass sections. Nearly always, it is passed around – perhaps from the flutes, to the trumpet section, to the low brass, and maybe, back to the flutes. It is the main theme that identifies the work.

Melodies can be fast or slow; uplifting and light. They can be mournful, heavy; even ponderous. They might be simple or very involved and complicated. Melodies aren't always easy to sing or play. Some aren't particularly pleasing to the ear. They are called dissonant. Frequently, a melody is composed on a text or poetry; the arranger makes an effort to enhance or interpret the written word. Other times a melody emerges strictly as a tune and is developed as a theme.

Sing a song every night and day, A melody that will last always. I will forever sing my song, A melody that lives on and on.

Our lives are a lot like melodies. Some people enjoy a quiet, simple lifestyle. Others live in the fast lane.

They are busy, rushed, and thrive under constant pressure. Some live the good life and are in love with pleasure. Still others deal with worries and face troubling responsibilities on a daily basis. We could all come up with a theme song for our own lives. Would it be "Whistle While You Work," or "Sentimental Journey?" Maybe it's "Cry Me a River," "Stormy Weather," or "Blues in the Night." What about "Rock Around the Clock?"

As Christians, we all have a theme song running through our lives. Sometimes the melody is strong, and other times, even though it may be steady, it's quiet. Then, once in awhile, it may be difficult to hear altogether. That's what happens when we forget who we are; who we belong to, and become absorbed with matters of the world and our own sinful nature. Then it's time to face the music!

Just when I think there's no song to sing, I hear a melody that is everlasting. Everlasting melody!

That melody, that theme song, is Jesus Christ! His is the tune that is love and peace. His music sets us free from sin. His melody is everlasting! His song will go on and on into eternity..... Are you listening?

On August 23 we hit another grape cluster milestone. With an update from Brent Adney we have now placed our \$1,800,000.00 cluster on the Narthex wall. The total, "Thus far" is based on congregational giving, interest, and Estate gifts.

• Accelerated Gifts—Our timeline is moving very quickly, since the new addition will be done before our full 3 year commitment

cycle is up. We certainly want to encourage all of our members to consider accelerating their gifts. Accelerated gifts will help us push the loan off as long as we can and God willing, keeping our loan at the smallest level we can.

Lego Church

It's back and it's all done! We again say thanks to Adam Forman. Our Lego Church and addition needs NO new blocks or any taken off it. Here is how the finished church works:

- * In the church part, our kids can continue to place their gifts for our "Building Together in Faith" project.
- * In the gym part, they can place a registration form for a Lego block set to be given away at Rally Day.
- * One registration can be placed in the "gym" every time you are at worship. Parents can help the younger kids fill out the form.

The drawing for a large Lego set and three small sets will be on Rally Day, September 20 at 12:30 and then all the kids can go off for the Rally Day games in Pastor Urbach's back yard.

Special Needs

- * The Cross—On the Euclid Avenue side of the building, we are going to build in a very attractive brick cross. The cost of the cross is \$6,770.00. It might be that someone in the Parish would like to take on the cost of this project in honor or in memory of someone(s) who have been a part of their journey. You can see in the undated Architect mats in the Narthex a good idea of how it would look. It is designed to reflect, somewhat, our LCMS cross. If you are interested in championing this project, please speak to Pastor Urbach.
- * A complete Two-Court Scholastic Telescopic Volleyball System—This system provides four uprights and two nets which are adjustable for men's, women's, and junior heights, and can be adjusted to a tennis level to provide for pickle ball. The cost for the system is \$4,030.00. This includes shipping. Perhaps there is a family or several families who could put their heads and resources together to fund this. If 8 families all shared a gift of \$500.00 over and above their present commitments, we can have this by Dedication. Pastor Urbach knows one family already willing to do this. We just need 7 more families.



- Special Needs Continued
- * The Floor—in the basic bid, was a concrete floor with painted lines. The Building Committee has made a decision to install a tile floor with the edged in lines for Basketball, Volleyball and Pickle ball. Hopefully, continued giving will accomplish this; yet someone may be able to provide a gift for the floor. The additional money needed for a tile floor is approximately \$8,930.00.
- * The portable basketball system recommended by our Architect is Gared Sports Micro 2 System. The apparatus can be easily moved from half court to full court use. They will not provide for "dunking" (sorry Pastor Willms!), yet for our use they will serve us well. Cost is \$1,750.00 per unit. Both of these units have been paid for by two of our Parish families.



A Very Noisy Offering



- Q. What does a pickle jar, a coffee can, and a shoe box have in common?
- A. A really fun and painless way to help us close the financial gap as we near the end of our Building Phase of our "Building Together in Faith" campaign.
- O. How does it work?
- A. Well, many families have change jars so here is what we hope for—
 - That starting in September every family unit would start saving its change foe a "very noisy offering".
 - * Start by everyone in the family filling a pickle jar with change.
 - * Then, when the pickle jar is filled, pour your change into an empty coffee can;
 - * Then, when the coffee can is filled pour it into a shoe box, and
 - * Then, at what ever stage you are at, pickle jar, coffee can or shoe box, bring it to church in the season of Epiphany which begins Wednesday, January 6 until Ash Wednesday as we have a very noisy offering as we do the final remodeling of our transition into the new Building.
- Q. Why a pickle jar, a coffee can, or a shoe box?
- A. Well, a shoe box because lots of tennis shoes will use the new facility of all ages, walkers, volleyball and basketball players and—well, dodge ball at LYF and JYM. A coffee can because lots of coffee will be prepared and drank in that new Fellowship Hall. And a pickle jar—Yes a growing game in our community and throughout this country is Pickle ball. Pastor Urbach is eager to share the new games with a lot of people in the parish and the community.
- Q. Why not have a special Epiphany Celebration for the first day of our "very noisy offering" and sing the wisemen hymns, and have a big Epiphany star and read out the Matthew 2 account, why perhaps we could even have Wisemen.
- A. Good idea! Let's plan on a wonderful January 6 service at 6:30 p.m.
