

Reformation Day

Greetings to you in the name of the God of grace and glory! October 31 is the historic day of the Reformation! It is wonderful that it actually falls on a Sunday this year. We shall celebrate the glorious praise of God in the morning and then conclude our Day with a community outreach activity, namely Trunk 'N' Treat.

At both services on Reformation Day we will celebrate Holy Communion.

Generally we rotate our celebration of Holy Communion at alternate services each Sunday. Yet on some special occasions, like Reformation and the first Sunday in Lent, we have Holy Communion at both services. On other special days like Christmas Eve and Easter, due to time, logistics, and many visitors we do not celebrate the Lord's Supper.

Why is this spiritual feast so important in our worship life? Here is a good doctrinal statement of our belief.

"We believe that in, with and under the bread and wine that the very Body and Blood of Jesus Christ is really present."

Not all Christian churches teach this doctrine. Some teach the bread and wine, or perhaps even crackers and grape juice are but symbols of Christ's Body and Blood, they just represent Christ. Others teach that the elements actually change substance. That word would be "transubstantiation", the teaching that there is a change of substance.

We believe our teaching of real Presence is Biblical and correct. About the teaching of "Real Presence" we would say this, "we believe, teach and confess."

Due to our teaching we therefore practice "close" communion in contrast to "open" or "closed." We invite those who have been instructed in the confessional teaching of our church to join us for this Holy meal. It is a gathering of those with one accord to gather close to Christ and close in Fellowship with each other.

Because we practice close communion and not everyone teaches the same, we believe it is vital for proper instruction. That is why we have Adult classes, Com-

munion classes, and Confirmation classes

Now—it should also be known that there are instances and unique circumstances where we deal one-on-one with people in their journey of faith so that they can commune with us while special circumstances are resolved.

But at the core of our practice at Faith for many decades upheld by our Elders and Pastors is that:

We believe in the "Real Presence"

We practice "close" communion

We believe instruction is paramount

We will pastorally work with worshippers in a Pastoral manner to deepen their life of faith in the Kingdom of God and with our congregation.

This is also the reason we provide for our 5th-8th grades a wonderful opportunity to come to Early Communion classes in October. These dates are:

Saturday, October 2 9:00-12:00 and

Saturday, October 9 9:00-10:30

That brings us back full circle to Reformation, (by the way the circles in Luther's seal magnet you got are of importance!), we will celebrate the Sacrament of the Altar at both services. In the Reformation the proper Biblical teaching of the church was restored and it was distributed in both kinds, namely both the bread and wine were given to the communicant.

Reformation, Holy Communion, moments of Godly celebration, *"therefore with the angels and the arch-angels and with all the company of heaven we laud and magnify thy glorious name evermore praising you and saying..."*

May Christ bless you in each and every moment we spend in His Holy Sanctuary.

Building Fund

Odds & Ends We thank Jay Fredrich for finishing a portion of the ceiling in the St. Mark Room. We had Leidholt, McNeely & Leidholt raise some duct work to accommodate a flush ceiling.

We are grateful to Todd's Electric for finishing the lights in the St. Mark Room as a gift.

Todd's Electric also did some landscaping by the North lawn drain to keep water out of the Transformer.

Bulletin Boards will be placed in the hallway outside of the new rooms upstairs.

Bank West Short-term loan As of September 30 the Bank West Loan of \$56,000 had been reduced to a principal of \$31,015.25 and an additional \$478.15 in interest. Thank you, we have made great progress. Hopefully at our October 10 Stewardship meeting more will be applied to the loan. At our last meeting, \$9,500.00 was applied to this loan.

Our 30 year Church Extension Fund Loan We have been able through gifts to do seven advanced payments as of October 1 in addition to our four regular payments. Our seven advanced payments have already saved us \$33,299.88 in interest.

How much is a regular payment? Our monthly payment is \$5,836.00. This adds about \$72,000 a year to our Budget. Hence, our General offering, our Building Fund gifts, and all designated gifts for Debt Retirement are very important.

All for one, and one for all. No one person can do this by themselves, but together, with all of us doing a bit extra, we can continue to meet our new obligation.

St. Matthew & St. Mark Matthew's room is all done and the St. Mark room is very useable!

St. Luke, John, and Paul will be finished after we are able to install an elevator as per our City Building Codes.

Building Fund Envelopes As members choose to extend their Building Fund giving by six months we would ask you to: 1) use the monthly envelope in

your church envelope boxes, 2) each month we will provide one additional envelope, 3) if you need additional envelopes, please use the remaining charitable envelopes found on the Oak Table in the Narthex.

If you have extra "Hot Pink" Building Fund envelopes, please return them so we don't have to print any more than we have to. Thank you.

Our New Cup We want every family to have one of our new Christian Family Life Center mugs. Please pick one up for your family today.

Dedication Day Bulletins are also on the cup table if you desire to see the day's events, please pick one up. Services from that day will be available on DVD, if you would like one let us know.

What is happening in our 1961 really old Fellowship Hall? This room is now beginning to provide some very organized storage for things like Mardi Gras, Christmas decorations, Parish Fellowship, Country Fair, etc., etc.

It is also going to serve as a music area for the choir warm-ups on Sunday mornings and an area for Sunday school music.




A Letter of Thanks




Join us Tuesday, October 19, that's the third Tuesday for a *Seniors' Gathering* potluck noon meal.

Operation Christmas Child

Priscilla Circle is sponsoring a project this year called "Operation Christmas Child" or the "Shoebbox Project".

We will be collecting items (that are listed below) and placing them in a "shoe box" (regular size shoe box or small plastic container about the size of a shoe box). Then these gifts will be shipped overseas for underprivileged children or children who were victims of earthquakes, etc.

If anyone would like to join us in this, you may drop your filled box (marked with age group and if for a girl or boy) or you may just purchase some items (there will be a drop box marked for this) and we will get them ready. Another way you could help would be monetary. This would help with the shipping or buying items to finish a shoe box. It costs us \$7.00 per box to ship.

The children's age categories are 2-4, 5-9, 10-14—girl or boy. The labels for the boxes may be gotten at the church. The boxes should not be sealed, just a rubber band around them.

The Project will start September 1 and will run to October 31. We encourage all members to join us in this endeavor and put a smile on some children's faces.

GIFT IDEAS:

SCHOOL SUPPLIES: pens. Pencils and sharpeners, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

TOYS: small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, small Etch-A-Sketch, toys that light up or make noise (with extra batteries), Slinky, etc.

HYGIENE ITEMS: tooth brush, tooth paste, mild bar soap (in a plastic zip bag), comb, washcloth, etc.

OTHER: hard candy or lollipops (please double bag these) mints, gum, T-shirts, socks, ball caps, sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries).

A PERSONAL NOTE:

In a separate envelope, you may enclose a note to

the child and a photo of yourself or your family (If you include your name and address the child may write back).

DO NOT INCLUDE: Used or damaged items, war related items such as toy guns, knives, military figures, chocolate or food, out of date candy, liquids or lotions, medications or vitamins, breakable items such as water globes or glass containers, aerosol cans.


