A Message From Pastor Urbach

A blessed Advent & Christmas! Spring, Summer, Fall, Winter—what are your favorite seasons? Mine...well, glad you asked. The answer is...Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter.

Our Christmas tree this year will be special to me because it is from my front yard. It is a beautiful tree, but after dying grass and pricked fingers from pine needles, I thought it was time to re-do my corner next Spring. So this year's tree is pretty special. Trees—Healing! In the Biblical Book of Revelation we find marvelous passages about trees and healing. *"Then the angel showed me the river of life, as clear as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb down the middle of the great street of the city. On each side of the river stood the tree of life, bearing twelve crops of fruit, yielding its fruit every month. And the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations."* Rev. 22:1-4

What an image of heaven. As a matter of fact read chapters 21 and 22, to get a full picture. Heaven is remarkable. The trees bearing fruit and the leaves bringing healing...healing for the nations. There, in heaven we will see the face of the Lamb of God.

The year 2012 has been a year of healing for me. Prior to this year I felt I was pretty dent proof. This year I know what it is like to struggle with pain and aging body parts. So, the healing that I have prayed for this beloved people of God over these 38 years has meant even more as people have prayed for the pastor. Thank You! Pain and discomfort can isolate us, but I have been so grateful and thankful to also be a part of your prayers.

Trees — I think of the cross, trees—I think of the manger, trees—I think of our beautiful State Capitol Rotunda, trees—I think of a special tree in our sanctuary, trees—I donated trees to the City of Pierre in honor of my grandchildren. These trees in Steamboat Park by the amphitheater that I hope will bring shade to you and your families. So trees, healing and "faces".

"They will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads." Rev. 22:4.

On Sunday, November 18 & 25 I could not raise my left arm to speak the words of Numbers 6 to you.

"The Lord said to Moses, Tell Aaron and his sons, 'This is how you are to bless the Israelites. Say to them: "The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine upon you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace.' So they will put my name on the Israelites, and I will bless them." Numbers 6:22-27

These wondrous words of Numbers 6, that your pastors speak to you each Sunday now hang over my office door. This beautiful piece of art was a gift to me from Hilary Lee & Shane Shepherd on the occasion of their wedding in November! Now as you enter my office or leave my office the very Words of God convey God's Blessings upon your life journey. I would say it again, speaking these privileged words over you continues to move me even after the thousands of times I have spoken them.

I have hundreds of moments & memories of my life as pastor among you as I prepare for my 39th Christmas Eve with you. God willing I will have a 40th year with you and then I will see Christ-

mas from the pew side. I properly should have waiting one more year for the tree but this will be the right year to re-do some things at my home and in the yard. But, back to "faces", lately I seem to wander off in thought about what a joy Faith has been to me. Through my mind runs the pictures of hundreds and hundreds of faces. I have been able to proclaim to you about our Lord who has turned His face toward you to give you peace.

Surprise Package




The musical group **Surprise Package** will be performing their annual

The men of the Congregation are invited to our Men's Fellowship Christmas Party. We will meet in the


Living Room. Please bring a snack to share, beverages will be provided. We will play a few hands of Court Whist with gift certificates for the highest and lowest scores.




A Message from Pastor Baumann

Habakkuk 2:4b “but the righteous will live by his faith.”

Advent greetings in the name of our coming King—the Lord Jesus Christ! Advent—it’s a time of waiting and anticipation. The very word Advent means “coming.” This season of the church year should stir our hearts and our minds to anticipate the arrival of the Babe at Bethlehem as we wait for His coming. Sometimes it’s not easy to wait, and we all know what it’s like to wait. We wait for payday to come, for that new addition to our family, for our wives to get ready to go out, for our husbands to apologize, for our kids to take out the trash, we wait for those warmer days of spring to arrive. We all know what it’s like to wait, and sometimes it’s just plain hard to do. As we look at the world around us, we wait. We wait for the King to come again to restore, renew, and right creation. It’s a tough world we live in. It’s hard to see sickness and sadness, divorce and discord, violence and vengeance have their way in our world. Yet, once again we are in a time of waiting. Greetings from Faith Lutheran Daycare!


Winter is upon us and boy are we ever ready to get into the snow! The children have patiently been waiting for the snow and for their (and the staff's) favorite time of year... Christmas!
