

Circuit Bible Camp

WHO: For those in 4th to 9th grade as of the 2013/2014 school year (so anyone who just finished 3rd grade through those just having finished 8th grade this past school year are eligible to attend). A sign-up sheet is on the back table in the narthex along with a release waiver and a packing list for each participant to grab.

WHAT: Four days and three nights of recreational fun and camping at the Oahe Downstream Campground. We hope to have youth from our Circuit (Onida, Blunt, Harrold, Gettysburg, Presho, Norris, Murdo, Lebanon, & Pierre) come together for time and study in God's Word under the theme: "*And God said...*" We will swim, hike, cook our meals outside, canoe & kayak, ride on the Capital City Queen. We will also have Bible study, play games, sleep in tents, explore nature. & more! On Wed. July 24th, families are welcome to join for an evening cookout with our group at 6:30 until dark as we celebrate family night. We have a shelter at the campsite also!

A Year in the Making...

“Good things take time!”, or as another saying puts it: “Good things come to those who wait.” Some will argue that Marriage gets better with age. The same must hold true then for fine wines, and yes, being from Wisconsin—for Cheese also! But waiting is sometimes hard to do, just ask any deer hunter or expecting mother. We live in an age of instantaneous response and rapid production. “30 minutes or less...” was the guarantee on pizza delivery, “Or it’s free!”

The psalmist David wrote in Psalm 40; “I waited patiently for the Lord He inclined and heard my cry...” And again in Psalm 130; “My soul waits for the LORD, more than watchmen wait for the morning, more than watchmen wait for the morning.” Waiting is one thing, but waiting patiently is yet another. This is the life of God’s people. God doesn’t always work on 30 minute time frames! We are people who wait on God’s action, on God’s timing, and on His working in our lives. We wait for God to give us a spouse, to bless us with the endurance to make it through years of schooling, we wait until Sunday morning to receive absolution and forgiveness from the Pastor as from God Himself (although some choose to wait a little longer than others!) We wait for God to show us the right path in our vocations and life callings. We wait for God to call us from death to eternal life through the voice of Jesus the Good Shepherd. This waiting is a tough thing to do especially when the Psalms say that God’s timing is different than ours! “For a thousand years

in your sight are like a day just gone by, or like a watch in the night” Psalm 90:4.

One of my favorite Greek words is the word *kairos* (*kai-rus*) which means: *at the proper time, appointed time, at just the right time, or at the exact moment.* **Romans 5:6-8** says; “You see, **at just the right time** (*kairos*), when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous man, though for a good man someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates His love for us in this: While we were still sinners Christ died for us.” It was the *kairos* moment. Jesus came at *just the right time!* And none too soon. Jesus then died on a ruthless, rugged cross when waiting could no longer suffice. God waited for the right moment in history to send His Son. This moment was promised to Adam and Eve in Genesis, told of by the Judges and by the Prophets, and even after a time of captivity for Israel and Judah God still held out for the right timing. What a relief that God knows when “just the right time is” because the truth is: waiting is difficult for us to do!

How is God teaching you and growing you to wait on Him and to put a more complete trust in His Word? In His promises? When you become sick and tired of waiting for God let your voice to God not be your own, but lift up your voice to God in the words of the Psalms, read the Psalms, listen to their voice to God. Psalm 119:81 “My soul faints with longing for your salvation, but I have put my hope in your word.” I pray that you

would always go back to God’s word, back to His faithful promises.

It’s God’s timing. And in His timing He has brought me to this congregation. It’s been a full year, and what a year in the making it has been! After waiting for 4 years of college and waiting for 4 years of seminary, I get to see the fruition of God’s timing in my life. This past year I have been able to grow as a pastor through preaching, I have attended two Pastor’s conferences, experienced my first SD winter, led a junior high lock-in, led a trip to the National Youth Gathering, coordinated Vacation Bible School with the help of dedicated leaders, coordinated a successful year of Sunday School, led men’s Bible study on Thursday mornings throughout the year, grieved with families yet celebrated in the hope of Christ through numerous funerals at Faith, married my first couple, baptized children, taught confirmation, and fundraised, fundraised, and fundraised some more! So I thank you, and I thank God for all of the love and patient support that has been shown. This is truly one of the best places on earth, and it’s because of you—God’s people—something truly worth waiting for. May you eagerly watch for God’s love and wait on His promises with hope and joy this day and always.

in such a manner that it attracts the soot from the candles. A cloth wipes the soot off. This time, after cleaning the walls, we will paint with a semi-gloss rather than a flat paint. Jay Fredrich, on behalf of our Board of Trustees, has sought proposals for painting costs. Close inspection also finds some drywall tape pulling away in the seams between the ceiling and the walls. Painting Cost: \$6,100.00

- You have noticed the difficult billowing we have in our Sanctuary carpet especially in the summer months. Our Trustees have been pulling back carpet, re-cutting, and re-gluing. It seems like they get one spot down and another spot billows up. We are concerned about people getting their feet tied up and stumbling. We have been piece-mealing for years and feel it is time to replace the entire carpet and adhesive.

Carpet Cost: About \$25,000.


- **Together as a Synod:** Help us support our Synod's work where it's needed most. Goal:\$200,000
