



THE PORTER!

Greetings to you in our Ascended Lord Jesus Christ. As this June newsletter arrives in your home I am so grateful that I have had the opportunity to extend my public ministry among you for awhile.

In hindsight, I am grateful that I didn't walk across the street on August 31st all done. Hindsight again, I think I would have been a bit lost.

So the parish and Pastor Urbach have had a healthy time of adjustment. You have gotten used to Pastor Urbach not being the Senior Pastor and I have had two joys, the joy of still being able to be a part-time pastor in your midst doing things I love to do while handing over things that were not mine to do any longer.

The second joy is to be able to be gone without feeling guilty. It has reduced the stress in this 70 year old body greatly.

I think this transition time has been good and healthy for us all.

I recently read an article by Father Michael Griffin who is being assigned to St. Mary Catholic Church in Aberdeen. Father Griffin has served St. Peter & St. Paul and our community well. He quoted Chapter 66 of the Holy Rule about the establishment of the *porter* of the monastery:

At the gate of the monastery let there be placed a wise old man, who knows how to receive and to give a message, and whose maturity will prevent him from straying about. This porter should have a

room near the gate, so that those who come may always find someone at hand to attend to their business. And as soon as anyone knocks or a poor person hails him, let him answer "Thanks be to God" or "A blessing!" Then let him attend to them promptly, with all the meekness inspired by the fear of God and with the warmth of charity.

I would like to think of that as a summary of my now, almost 41 years among you. Furthermore, I would like to think it describes our parish, not as a monastery of course, but as an assembly of believers who have the "warmth of charity" and Christian hospitality.

We are all "*porters*", we are doormen who stand at the doors of the loving assembly, the great assembly of believers at Faith Lutheran Church. We stand at the meeting place between earth and heaven.

On Mother's Day, this retired pastor was just a parishioner. No robes, no collar, just sitting in the pew, singing away and worshipping God, hearing the Good News of Jesus Christ. During the "welcome each other" and after the service I made it a point to greet others, especially new members and visiting people. One of the newer people in our worshipping assembly laughed when I shook his hand and said, "Pastor, you still are working the crowd." Indeed I always will. Whatever my role in the days ahead, even as a pedestrian who is a part of our Faith family I pray I will always be a porter, an ambassador of good will for Christ and for the wonderful assembly of believers of

Faith Lutheran.

This reminds me of grandson Cody. When Cody was about 6 or 7 he was home for Easter. As we greeted people he grabbed me and said, "Grandpa can I go and shake hands like you?" Obviously I said yes. So the personable young man proceeded to greet all the people he could. What a neat moment.

Let's all strive to invite, to greet, to share the love of Christ.

So pick your name, "wise old man," a doorman, a gate keeper, a *porter* and let us say to one another, "Thanks be to God."

In the love of the Master *Porter* Jesus Christ Himself,

SOAK UP THE "SON!"

I have often said jokingly, "Cats are solar-powered!" You can almost believe that to be true with how many times you'll see a cat just lying in a window, on the carpet, or in the driveway so perfectly positioned directly in the sunlight. Maybe it's the warmth or the brightness of the sun. I'm not sure exactly why that's the case, but it is and I can sure remember my grandparent's cats one moment lying lazily in the sun but when evening came, it was like there were totally different cats in the house! Had someone flipped a switch on them?

Jesus' disciples had three years to soak up all the time they possibly could with the Son of God and the Savior of the world. And just like my grandparent's cats, it didn't really look like they had done a whole lot while in the presence of the "Son." It looked like those disciples and followers were spiritually dormant. Peter denied Jesus, Thomas would not believe the resurrection account unless he saw it with his own eyes and felt it with his hands, the women went to go and anoint a dead Jesus after He had repeatedly told them He was going the rise on the 3rd day, the disciples didn't trust the Savior and woke the Master because they thought that He didn't care about their situation in the storm on the Sea of Galilee, Peter doubts the words of Christ and sinks while walking to Jesus on the Sea of Galilee. Oh yes, it definitely appears like the disciples are anything *but* disciples when they are in His pres-

ence- lethargic, lazy, lost.

But, isn't it true that sometimes you *do* appreciate something more once you don't have it? If your power goes out, or your water is shut off, you know what I mean! I think that was the case with the disciples. Listen how Peter preaches the Law and the Gospel, and how the Church begins to come alive in the darkness as St. Peter speaks and preaches with conviction in Acts chapter 2. I can picture the energy of Peter's preaching in Acts 2:22-24 "*Men of Israel, Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders, and signs, which God did among you through Him, as you yourselves know. This man was handed over to you by God's set purpose and foreknowledge; and you with the help of wicked men, put Him to death by nailing Him to the cross. But God raised Him from the dead, freeing Him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on Him.*" Had someone flipped a switch on these followers of Christ?

There is a saying out there, "Absence makes the heart grow fonder." After His death on the cross, you get a sense that the followers of Christ truly did miss Him. I wonder sometimes, "Do I live as though I miss Christ?" Or do I carry on life with an attitude of; "It's business as usual." In the absence of Christ after His ascension into heaven, it appears like the disciples "come alive!" They were actually basking in the rays of the "Son" all along! They absorbed His teachings. They believed the message. They

saw the nail and spear marks of the crucified and risen Christ! When Christ was with them, they had the light! (*John 1:4-9*) When He was gone they missed Him! However, it doesn't take long in Jesus' absence for it to feel like the darkness is overpowering. We too see this in our own world. While Christ is away, Satan will play. The Disciples and Apostles were so energized and convicted by this Jesus and His message of eternal life, that just about all of them sacrificed their lives for the Savior they believed in. All but one were reportedly murdered and martyred for the message they believed in.

It may appear like your children or your own family aren't listening to you or to the church. It may appear like they aren't getting the message of faith as they seem to go against, or even ignore your Christian encouragement and love toward them. But don't be mistaken, they're listening, they're watching. They may not always get it right, or get it right away, but they will. When we live our lives in accord with the teachings of Jesus Christ, and in His hope, we bring the light of the "Son" into the lives of others. They'll bask in it. It will warm their hearts. It will enliven them so when they stand on their own two feet in college, or in a relationship, or the midst of a joy or tragedy, they'll be "powered" by the Spirit of God to do what God

would have them do, to hope in the God that has saved and rescued them from their sin through the cross and open grave of Jesus Christ.

Jesus invigorates us! His message is an invigorating message! We believe that He died for sinful men at the hands of sinful men as the Scriptures foretold, but that He conquered death and lives and reigns to all eternity. This Easter Sunday message is 52 Sundays a year! And that's why we soak up the Son every "Son" day in worship. We soak up Jesus when we read God's Word, when we memorize our Bible and pray. God wrings us out on the world when we love others. We are love-soaked followers and we pour out God's love all over the world around us. So go ahead, soak up the "Son" every chance you get! Be in the Word, write Bible verses in magic marker on your shower curtain so when you brush your teeth you constantly see and read them. Listen to our Christian radio station, and attend Christian

concerts. Go to www.LCMS.org or concordiatheology.org and search out what is happening in the church and see if there's something out there you can pray for, or donate to, or learn more about. It may just be that you may bring the light of God to someone who desperately needs it. What once was dormant, now is alive! "As long as it is day, we must do the work of Him who sent me. Night is coming, when no one can work. While I am in the world, I am the light of the world." - Jesus

God bless you as you live in the light, and soak up the "Son" this summer!




CONTINGENCY FUND

The Board of Stewardship wishes to thank the congregation for the extra efforts over the Lenten season. At some point we will have a Senior Pastor whose compensation package will be for larger than what we currently provide for Pastor Urbach who is serving as part-time Vacancy Administrative Pastor. We wish to be prepared for this.

Three important items for our current parish stewardship—

First—we hope many of you found during the Lenten season the ability to raise your giving., and we hope that you will continue doing so.

Second—in the summer months please remember your steadfast giving especially when you are gone for summer activities.

You might decide to use Simply Giving, an automatic withdrawal plan as a way to give consistently. Stop by the church office and Helen, our office administrator can help you with the paperwork. Many families find this to be a mode of giving that is very helpful.

Third—The Board of Stewardship has initiated a Contingency Fund Line. When we, in the summer months, find it necessary to meet our financial objectives we have sometimes borrowed internally from monies designated for other projects to meet our General Fund needs.

The monies are always paid back! Henceforth, we are going to have just one fund we borrow from. It will be our Contingency Fund. When we go into this fund to meet

our obligations we will always let the congregation know this!

The goal set by the Board of Stewardship is “by the end of 2016 to have set aside Contingency Fund of \$30,000 minimally.”

The fund is being funded by:

- Placing into the Fund a gift of \$9,506.94 given to the parish many years ago by Vic & Dorothy Young. It was an undesignated gift of stock that was cashed and placed into a special project fund.
- Up to \$100.00 a week from the plate offering will be placed into the newly established Contingency Fund.
- Finally, we hope that as members would like to do some special giving to assist the church, they would consider this fund.

Delmont Tornado



On Mother's Day, May 10, Zion Lutheran Church and its parsonage were de-

stroyed. In addition, the homes of five of its members were either destroyed or damaged.

Zion Delmont was established in 1896 and its church was built in the early 1900's. The Pipe Organ and the wood carved Altar containing the Lord's Supper were made in Germany and shipped to South Dakota.
