Intentional Interim Pastor's Report

Interim: an intervening time, a space of time between events or states.

That is the dictionary definition of "interim." It also might be viewed as working to prevent "on the rebound" with the next pastor. The familiar partner is gone and the pain is new. An interim leaves time to settle, grow, and look at things in a new light. An interim is not about what the interim pastor does, it is about who the congregation is.

To that end, my focus has been on allowing space so that interactions can grow, communication increase, and new ways of doing things begin to emerge. How some of this would look is much different than what I had planned and expected. It is called working with people. And is part of working alongside the Holy Spirit.

Notable steps along the way have been in March when congregational leaders encouraged and found new congregational leaders. The task took an incredible amount of interaction. Much was learned along the way. By myself, as well as others.

Another notable phase of this interim so far has been the congregational on-line survey. The idea rose from the congregation, it was done by the congregation and reported by congregational leaders to the congregation.

Many boards have had leaders emerge from within. Some are new persons and others found themselves in new roles. Other leadership positions have experienced changes that were coming, but have come to pass in the past 11 months.

The interim between ending and restarting the call process for a Senior Pastor has come to an end. The interim between the retirement of the previous senior pastor, Pastor Urbach, and the arrival of whoever it is that the Lord knows will be the next senior pastor continues.

Our five-year-old session meets on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday mornings from 9:00-11:30. Our regular sessions are Tuesday and Thursday, both morning 9:00-11:30 and Tuesday and Thursday afternoon 1:00-3:30. Donna Gohl & Dusti Palecek serve as teacher assistants on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Anita Marso & Beth Hand work all day Tuesday and Thursday. They all do an excellent job!

Our Thrivent funds are used for educational materials, equipment and toys.

Each month we study a specific shape, number, color and letter, as well as rotate the toys, puzzles, books and games from the storage closets. It is our goal that the children will not only hear that God loves them, but see that love through us. Both daycare and preschool implement Christian curriculum purchased from the Concordia Publishing House in teaching their children stories from both the Old and New Testament.

Faith Lutheran Preschool, directed by Jan Larson,

holds three classes during the week: two Tuesday/Thursday classes and one Monday/Wednesday/Friday class. The class size per school year ranges from 20-25 students. Jan has done a tremendous job with returning staff. Thus far the classes and staff are doing great!

Faith Lutheran Daycare, directed by Jenny Hovelson, is licensed to oversee more than 65 children. The daycare staff have monthly meetings and are required to take part in various childhood education training sessions throughout the year. In addition, the State of South Dakota performs three annual inspections of the daycare: safety inspection, file inspection, and nutrition inspection. The daycare is currently working to get everything organized and up to date.

Jenny has transitioned nicely into her new role and done an exceptional job increasing daycare enrollment up to full capacity, juggling staff to meet childcare needs, and keeping weekly activities engaging, fun, and educational.

Jay Friedrich and Lori continue to keep the preschool and daycare in pristine condition and provide assistance with various repair projects throughout the year. The board is grateful to Jay and Lori for their dedication to the daycare and preschool facilities.

We are also thankful for Pastors Baumann and Barbey, the church council, the church staff, and Beth King for their encouragement and support of both the daycare and preschool.

In the final quarter of the year the congregation was once again issued a challenge to reduce the amount of our Church Extension Fund Loan for our Christian Family Life Center. A generous family in our congregation offered to match all debt retirement gifts given though December up to \$10,000.00. You took on the challenge in a big way. A total of \$31,311.50 was given which then turned in to a total of \$41,311.50 with the family's match. As a result of the challenge, the balance of the Church Extension Fund Loan is now \$318,079.74. Through December 2016 we've made a total of 172 advance payments resulting in a savings of \$568,896.23 in interest!

The Board developed and implemented a travel reimbursement plan for the Pastors and other Church leaders when they are travelling for Church business. Additionally, the Board replenished the Sunday school envelops so that the children could feel that they are contributing to the well-being of the Church and at the same time, develop an understanding of giving.

Our Board would also like to stress that in addition to the financial support members of the congregation proved that it is important for members to also consider the giving of their time and talents in leading the church. Money has been called "the god of those who have too much, and the goal of those who have too little." Blessed indeed is the person who avoids these extremes. Max Anders said it well; "God wants us to have wealth; we must be careful not to settle for money." Our goal as God's people is to seek first God's kingdom and His righteousness. He has promised to take care of our needs.

In the year of our Lord 2014, our total giving as a congregation was \$754,508.36, of which was the General Fund at \$547,013.99 and the Building Fund of \$100,965.06. The rest was comprised of miscellaneous gifts. The year 2013 was the second highest giving year in the history of our church, only exceeded by 2009 at \$904,313.28 in the very middle of our Christian Family Life Center Building Project.

Thank you for your steadfast and sacrificial giving that not only has sustained our Building Fund but also maintained the daily life of our congregation.
