

have the opportunity to receive ashes. Worshippers will not be required to participate, but the service will be structured so that those who would like to receive ashes may.

Thanks and kudos

I would like to thank the boards, congregational leaders, and auxiliaries of Faith for the willingness they have shown to take hold and grapple with issues, take up tasks that are new to them, and to communicate with each other.

Also, a thank you to those who gather in worship for realizing that it is just that. A gathering. And for realizing that any group of gathered anything will not all be alike. Some of you have told me that you *disliked* things that are new/different. Others of you have told me you *liked* the exact same thing. Which is fine. Because the church does not exist for us (who are quite different people), but we, the church, exist because Jesus who fills all things everywhere, and it is He who makes us one (Colossians 1:17-18).

This interim has been filled with learning. Not data (though there has been some of that),

but with human growth, shifting relationships, and renewed realizations. Not everything is perfect (if it were, why would God need to forgive anyone anything?). But the times of life that end up meaning more tend to be imperfect: a new baby, a better job, going off to school, retiring, healing. We can learn better to lean on God and accept the peace that passes understanding (Philippians 4:6-7).

And further I thank you for your trust. That most often shows itself to me when we disagree and can express it, knowing that Who unites us is stronger than the specific difference of view, calling in life, or opinion that may be causing anxiety.

May the Word of Christ dwell in you richly, as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom, and as you sing and make melody in your hearts to the Lord (Colossians 3:17).

BEHOLD A BRANCH IS GROWING

“A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit.” Isaiah 11:10

Years ago, “Behold a Branch is Growing,” was found near the back of The Lutheran Hymnal. We’d sing it occasionally during Advent, but it wasn’t really one of my favorites. It seemed kind of obscure to me. A different translation, “Lo, How a Rose E’er Blooming,” was more appealing in my young mind.

Behold a branch is growing of loveliest form and grace,
As prophets sung, foreknowing; it springs from Jesse’s race
And bears one little Flower in midst of winter,
At deepest midnight hour.

When I was growing up, it was very common for people to go into the woods to cut down their own Christmas tree. As you know, once the tree is cut down, the stump always remains behind. We didn’t take it with us; it was

left in the ground, drained of all its life. Stumps aren’t that great, other than maybe providing a place to sit. People pay to have them removed from their property.

Back in 500 BC and beyond, Israel’s status was like a stump. The nation was politically and spiritually dead. Israel’s reliance on the Lord didn’t last. Its individual family trees weren’t exactly flourishing either. They were cut down. Mary and Joseph were from Nazareth – and you might recall the quote, “What good can come from there?” In fact, no one opened their door when the young mother was about to give birth.

However, back in the woods, if you were to go back to the site a few weeks later, you might be surprised to find a few signs of life present in the form of little shoots growing out of the stump. Isaiah was speaking of a shoot coming forth from the stump of Jesse, King David’s father. This shoot spelled

hope, and it had a name – Jesus! That shoot, that Branch, bore fruit for the purpose of reconciling our relationship with the Father. Jesus produced peace between us and God. We are forgiven and are part of God’s family, we are grafted to Him. When we are connected to Jesus, the Branch grows in us.

This Flower, whose fragrance tender with sweetness fills the air,
Dispels with glorious splendor the darkness everywhere.
True Man, yet very God; from sin and death He saves us
And lightens every load.
