Now we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands. Meanwhile we groan, longing to be clothed with our heavenly dwelling, because when we are clothed, we will not be found naked. For while we are in this tent, we groan and are burdened, because we do not wish to be unclothed but to be clothed with our heavenly dwelling, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life. Now it is God who has made us for this very purpose and has given us the Spirit as a deposit, guaranteeing what is to come. Therefore we are always confident and know that as long as we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord. We live by faith, not by sight. (2 Corinthians 5:1-7)

Mow that the warmer weather is finally here, many people are spending more time outdoors. For some, the warm weather brings the excitement of camping. I've been on several camping trips and, genuinely speaking, they were always fun. The fresh air, the smell of the wood fire and the bacon in the morning. After a few days of that, however, the novelty begins to wear off. When it

rains, campers are usually limited to tents or RV's. And, after a few days, it didn't take too long to realize that all of us could use a good shower. Camping can be fun, but coming home can be even more fun. Tents and RV's are good for travelers and temporary campers. But houses are where we really live.

The Apostle Paul was going through a rough spot as he wrote these inspired words. He used words like "hard pressed" and "wasting away" to describe his life in his earthly "tent" (his body). What Paul was expressing is the difficulty of life in a sinful world.

Perhaps you or a loved one has or is going through a surgery, an illness, or some tragedy. God has designed each of us with a time stamp. You can see it in the gray hair, scars and wrinkles our bodies bear. We're not going to live here forever. All signs point to that. We would be foolish to think and act as if this is all there is.

As believers we know that God has made us

for the purpose of living with him in heaven for the rest of eternity after our "tenting" is done. He's promised us a body—the real "house" that will be like Christ's glorified body. He made all that possible for us by giving us his Son, Jesus, as the Savior of the world. He also "tented" for a while here, living perfectly and then giving that perfect life as a ransom for us all. We've also been

given faith in Jesus by the Holy Spirit, who lives in us and is a kind of down payment, keeping us on layaway for heaven and all the glorious things that means for us! These eyes of faith see the reality in God's word and promises.

Knowing you have a home means you can enjoy your camping weekend and live it fully because you're not trapped in a tent.
Knowing you're going home to

heaven someday means that your life is fulfilled as you live each day for Jesus. See what wonderful things he can do with you before your tent wears out!

Summer! It is synonymous with the word vacation; taking a trip. The destination might be nearby or far away. Whether it's Mount Rushmore, Disney World, Europe, a road trip or a cruise, it will involve preparation. Setting off on a trip requires planning for weeks, maybe even months. Even a day trip calls for a little planning. Making reservations, stopping the mail, packing the bags, loading and fueling the vehicle. How about a map? No one would undertake a long car trip without a map; and without a driver, one wouldn't get very far. A pilot wouldn't take off for a remote destination without a flight chart. In fact, the plane wouldn't get off the ground without a pilot. In the same way, a conductor wouldn't attempt to lead a rehearsal without a musical score. Actually, a rehearsal without a director would be rather trying and laborious – even chaotic.

Open now the crystal fountain, whence the healing stream doth flow;

Let the fire and cloudy pillar lead me all my journey through;

Strong deliverer, be Thou still my strength and shield.

The hymn writer speaks of traveling through life – an uncharted tangle of tomorrows, twists and turns. We are like the pilgrims in the hymn verse, fumbling through life, carrying more baggage than we'll ever need, trying to decide what path to take and struggling to make decisions. Life didn't come with a map.

When I tread the verge of Jordan, bid my anxious fears subside;

Death of death and hell's destruction, land me safe on Canaan's side;

Songs of praises, I will ever give to Thee.

I enjoy traveling home to Minnesota and attending the parish I grew up in. One of Immanuel's charter members was my great grandfather. He was a German immigrant, who arrived in this country as a young boy. His family had very little and spoke no English, but they had mettle and their faith in God. They – and many like them – were basically pilgrims; moving through new territory, experiencing hardships, surprises waiting at every turn. They relied on the Lord to guide them.

Pilgrims – that's what we are – moving along on the road we call life. We may be ill equipped for the trip, but – praise God! He has the map!


Little Dresses for Africa

Little Dresses for Africa is a mission outreach of Faith Lutheran LWML. Many people support this project which begins in February. Gently used pillowcases, laces, trims, buttons, and money are donated by church members, friends and relatives from across the United States. Volunteers cut the pillowcases to size and assemble kits on Monday evenings and Thursday afternoons. The do-at-home kits are sewn by Faith members, coworkers and friends.

This year a total of 385 dresses were displayed on the narthex wall from February to May. The LWML voted in April to send T-shirts and little dresses to Mexico to be distributed by Faith's Mexican Mission in May. A total of 146 t-shirts for boys were donated or purchased and then matched by 146 little dresses for the girls.

The remaining 239 dresses were sent to Little Dresses for Africa. Little Dresses for Africa is a Christian organization reaching over 83 countries including Africa, disaster areas, the Appalachians and South Dakota. Mission teams from the United States personally deliver the dresses to churches, orphanages and schools giving hope in the name of Jesus. The dresses serve as ambassadors that offer a way into homes or villages where LDFA volunteers teach simple lessons about clean water, primary education, basic health and community skills that make a difference in the lives of thousands of children.

Since 2009 Faith's LWML has contributed 1,752 dresses. Faith Lutheran has touched the lives of many little girls and given them hope one little dress at a time.





There is a parable told in India about a selfish man who inherited a rice field. The first year the man irrigated the field and it was fruitful. The water, in fact, flowed onto his neighbor's field and this too produced a bountiful harvest.

But the next year the selfish man decided: "Why should I let this water flow through my field into his? Water is precious and I must keep it." So he built a dam. This prevented the water from flowing into his neighbor's field but it proved disastrous to his own crop as well. Irrigation water nourished the field only

If we are selfish and keep it all for ourselves, our lives become stagnant, a dismal swamp of mere existence. But if we give back to God by giving to others, both the giver and the receiver share in the fruits of God's love.
