Pierre Food Pantry in March and April, local banks and credit unions will provide a percentage matching fund.

The food will be delivered to the Food Pantry on Friday, April 3<sup>rd</sup>. Volunteers are needed to help load up the food, haul it to the Food Pantry, and unload it there. **If you're able to help, please meet in the church Narthex at 11 a.m. on Friday, April 3<sup>rd</sup>.
