The Senior Pastor's Page

"He is not here; he has risen!" (Luke 24:6)

Was it the greatest hoax devised by human hands? Did He pass out and later, inside the tomb, recover and escaped? Did His followers steal His body and spread the story that He was still alive? Was there a twin brother that made an appearance or two after He died to make everyone think He was alive? Could there have been some sort of mass hypnosis, tricking people into believing that He died and rose again? Could all this be the product of legend, wishful thinking on the part of weak-minded people? I find it interesting that sometimes people will believe just about anything and everything... except the truth.

The truth about Lent is that our Savior died on the cross for the sins of the world; our sins included. It was our hands that whipped him and beat him. It was our hands that pounded the nails through his hands and feet. It was our voices that shouted "Crucify him! Crucify him!" It was our sins that crushed him under the punishment of God the Father's wrath.

Our sins, you say? But that happened thousands of years ago in a place thousands of miles away from here! How could I have anything to do with that?

Yet the Bible is clear, from the moment we were conceived in sin, we were there. The moment we looked at someone with lustful thought, we were there. The moment

we hated our brother or ridiculed our parents, we were there. The Prophet Isaiah places us at Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion when he writes: "he took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows ... he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities." There is no denying it. No way to rationalize it or explain it away. It was our sins which put Jesus on that cross. And it was His love for us that kept Him on His cross.

Yet, our Savior did not remain there. The truth about Easter is that Jesus rose to life on the third day. And because He rose to life, everything He ever said is absolutely true. Similarly, everything He ever claimed to be, He is. And everything He ever promised will come to pass. This is the reason we who believe in Him live each day in joy. This is the reason we live each day in certainty. This is the reason we carry on. Because Jesus lives, we who believe in Him will live also! There is then every reason to celebrate this victory with a life dedicated to serving God.

My friends, there is no well-designed hoax. No crazy conspiracy. No mass hypnosis. No twin brother. There's only Jesus, lovingly giving His life for you. There's only Jesus, giving you His victory over sin, death, and the devil. Good Friday and Easter Sunday, it's why our hearts will always be glad, and our tongues always rejoice.

"The First Sign"

"This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory. And his disciples believed in him" (John 2:11). Our window for this month depicts Jesus' first miracle. He is invited to a wedding. The wine runs out, which was even more of a faux pas then than it would be today. Jesus solves the problem with water transformed into wine.

God has been turning water into wine since the dawn of creation. A collection of water vapor, a cloud, rolls across the sky. At some point, that water falls to the ground as rain. The grape vine's roots collect the water. It is transformed into nourishment for the plant. At the right time, this nutrition causes grapes to form. The grapes grow and increase in sweetness. They are harvested, squashed, and stored in barrels. Through the action of yeast, the sugars are converted into alcohol. Wine is born.

This simple process is so common that we can miss the miracle at play. God freely and actively transforms his creation into gifts for his people. But never before has he done this so rapidly. The entire process takes almost a year. Jesus condenses this into the span of a few sentences: collect water, draw some, give it to the master of the feast. It should come as no surprise that the God who creates the natural world can easily alter the course of those events.

What is surprising is who witnesses this miracle. To most of the guests, nothing special has occurred. They now have some fine wine to drink. But Jesus' disciples, as well as the servants, saw what he did and how he did it. Jesus manifested his glory, and his disciples believed in him. It's that simple. We witness the mighty deeds of Jesus and we believe. Some of the miracles are easy to miss. Others stand large in our sights. They all drive together at the same effect. Jesus manifests his power to us, and we believe in him.

The next time you drink some wine, perhaps even at a wedding, take time to reflect upon God's good creation. He orders and controls all the big events of the earth as well as giving the rains in their season. God is in charge of these "normal" things. And he also shows us his power in the "big" moments of life. In all of his actions, continue to place your trust in him. He is providing for you.

- These and other topics, plus all your questions, will be a part of our Adult Inquirer's Class


Everyone is invited to attend this class whether you wish to join in membership or not. Please call the office (224-2216) if you are planning to attend as we will get food for a noon meal.
