CREED (see insert) Athanasian

It is a tradition in many Christian churches to confess the Athanasian Creed on Trinity Sunday. In use since the 6th century, the Athanasian Creed is concerned with delineating the specific nature of each person in the Holy Trinity and, along with the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds, is one of the three "ecumenical" creeds confessed by all Christians. In the following text, the term "catholic," means the whole Christian Church as opposed to the more specific Roman Catholic Church.

- P All these things and whatever else You know that we need, grant us, Father, for the sake of Him who died and rose again and now lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God forever.




