
CONFESSION and **ABSOLUTION**


- P Let us then confess our sins to God our Father.










The lyrics were penned by author and civil rights activist James Weldon Johnson during the Harlem Renaissance. The music was composed by his brother, musician John Rosamund Johnson. The song is #964 in our Lutheran Service Book, and you may follow along as it is sung.

Keep us from pride of heart that delights more in what we do than in what You have done. Accept with our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving the tithes and offerings we bring this day. Lord, in Your mercy,

- P God of Israel, as Your people of old drank and were satisfied by Your abundant comfort shown to Jerusalem, may we likewise be satisfied to eat and drink of Your Son's body and blood, given for our comfort today. Lord, in Your mercy,







AS WE GATHER When Jesus sent out His followers to proclaim the Word of His kingdom to all who would listen, He assured them: "The one who hears you hears Me" (Luke 10:16).
