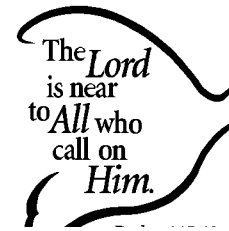

Since Scripture teaches that those people who do not fully understand the meaning of this meal eat and drink to their own harm (1Cor. 11:27-29), and because the Lord's Supper is the supreme act of stating our unity in faith and doctrine, we would ask those people who are visiting with us to **please speak with our pastors**, before communing, in order that we might fulfill our responsibility of properly instructing people in the right use of the precious Sacrament.



AS WE GATHER One of the three sung table graces included in *Lutheran Service Book* is “Be Present at Our Table, Lord” (*LSB* 775). The first part of the text, from around 1740, was written to be used before a meal began. It asks the Lord’s presence be at the dinner table. The text also has a parallel verse to be spoken or sung at the close of a meal:

We bless Thee, Lord, for this our food,
But more for Jesu’s flesh and blood;
The manna to our spirits giv’n,
The living bread sent down from heav’n;
Praise shall our grateful lips employ,
While life and plenty we enjoy;
'Till worthy, we adore Thy name,
While banqueting with Christ, the lamb.

The English author John Cennick thoughtfully ties together our daily eating at our home tables with our being together at the Lord’s Table at worship. Wherever our tables may be, the Lord is there with His blessing!

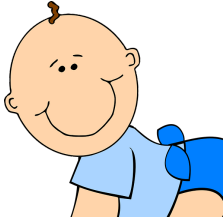
