





Since Scripture teaches that those people who do not fully understand the meaning of this meal eat and drink to their own harm (1Cor. 11:27-29), and because the Lord's Supper is the supreme act of stating our unity in faith and doctrine, we would ask those people who are visiting with us to please speak with our pastor, before communing, in order that we might fulfill our responsibility of properly instructing people in the right use of the precious Sacrament.






