C hear our prayer.

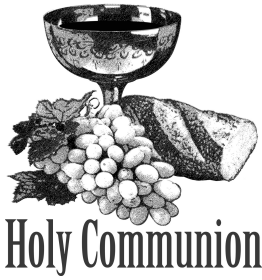

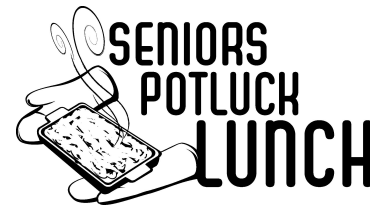
The Fed by Faith kitchen team needs your help! There are 2 ways to help, so if one doesn't work for your time or talents, please prayerfully consider the other option!

June 21, 2026**

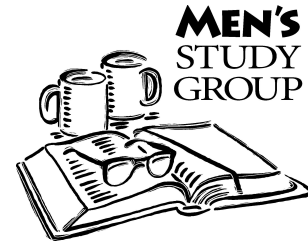
