Timeless Traditions Lent is a timeless tradition in the Lutheran Church. It is a helpful time to focus on the cross, our relationship with God, to seriously consider Christ's Sacrifice and to consider some type of sacrifice for ourselves such as giving something up for Lent or taking up a new project or discipline.

Lent is also a family time, therefore-

New Tradition—we have noticed, it seems, less children in evening Lenten Worship. While attendance at evening Lenten Worship is good, we desire more children to be a part of this timeless tradition. So here is a change of time during Lent.

Midweek and Lent The new change in Lenten Worship times on Wednesdays is a cooperative effort of our Board of Education, our Board of Elders and our Pastors.

Midweek remains 6:30-7:45, but as a part of our new Lenten tradition Lenten Worship will be a component of Midweek. After a 30 minute class our youth will go directly to the Sanctuary. We will start promptly at 7:00. Children should meet their families in the Narthex. If their family is not here that night they will be seated with their Midweek teacher.

- We are all done by 7:45
- Midweek kids have the same Midweek time frame as before—6:30-7:45.
- Learning & Worship, Midweek families and all the families of our church.
- Yes, for those who desire a time of fellowship after worship the High School youth will still provide goodies and even at that we will all still be home early.

Thrivent Choice Dollars Designated

Each month our church receives deposits from Thrivent Choice Dollars. Our Board of Stewardship waits until January every year to dispense these funds. The amount designated for Faith Lutheran in the year of 2012, was \$9,880.00. The Board of Stewardship, at its January meeting, designated the dollars as follows:

- \$1,000.00 to the South Dakota District for missions support of our District and Synod.
- \$192.74 for Thrivent crosses for our confirmands.
- \$500.00 for a washing machine for Daycare.
- \$1,000.00 to our Broadcast Work Program line to cover expenses of Sonrise and our

Cable Broadcast for those Sundays when we don't have a sponsor.

- \$2,500.00 to the Debt Retirement Account.
- \$4,000.00 for the High School Youth's trip to Synod's Youth Gathering to help 29 kids and 5 adults with lodging.
- \$687.26 to assist with a new projector.

What are Thrivent Choice Dollars?

Thrivent Choice Dollars are "Charitable Outreach Funds" that are given to charitable organizations. They are generated by the premiums that Thrivent policy holders pay for Thrivent based insurance policies.

Faith Lutheran Preschool received

\$3,361.00 in Thrivent Choice Dollars. The Board of Early Childhood Education has designated those monies for the general support of the Preschool.

Faith Lutheran Day Care—we are in the process of getting our Day-Care enrolled so that they also might be the recipient of Thrivent Choice Dollars.

Debt Retirement As we write, its good to know that on January 1 we made eight more advance payments. We have now made 89 advance payments saving \$366,260.11 in interest. Our balance is now \$824,125.57.

Our focus is now on Debt Retirement. We are not in need of “Building Account “ gifts as we have done all we intend to do at this time on the new addition.

The annual report will brings you up to date as to what we accomplished on the new addition this past year.

So our focus is being aggressive with the Debt Retirement account. You have a monthly Debt Retirement envelope in your offering envelope packet so there is not a Building Fund envelope in this newsletter. Extra envelopes are on the Oak Table in the Narthex if you need more envelopes for Debt Retirement.

Sanctuary Carpet The Trustees hope this year to replace the Sanctuary carpet. You have noticed in the spring, summer and early fall a lot of billowing. We have cut, sliced, and re-glued. It is time to replace, so be looking for updated news.
