Pastor Urbach's Message

Greetings to you in Behtlehem's Babe!

- Christmas Greeting
- Emeritus
- Extraordinary Giving

Advent has arrived and together we are walking to Bethlehem to celebrate God's extraordinary gift.

Christmas Greeting—So, in that spirit, Susan and I use this December Pastoral newsletter to wish all of you a blessed Christmas. How blessed we are to be part of a joyous family of believers. So a blessed Advent, Christmas and New Year!

Emeritus—that's what I now am. By our Synod's nomenclature I am "Pastor Emeritus." What does that word mean? It is based in Latin, "to earn by service," "Retired but retaining an honorary title corresponding to that held immediately before retirement."

So a retired pastor has earned by his faithful service to Christ's church that honorary title of Pastor. So even a retired pastor remains a pastor though now the title is honorary.

Many years ago when my son Jonathan was doing a co-op with Hutchinson Technologies in Hutchinson, MN, while a student at SDSM&T, I attended the church he was attending. The Pastor preaching that Sunday was "pastor emeritus" in this congregation. He was elderly (Boy that gets relative) but preached

well and was obviously loved by the congregation. I thought to myself how very neat that was, so I'm grateful as a "pastor emeritus" to still be able to preach occasionally and provide care for this beloved congregation.

Well, now you know what that "Pastor Emeritus" is.

Extraordinary Gifts! Sometimes I wish we had less appeals to the Congregation for "over and above" projects—and sometimes I wish we had a gold mine of financial reserves for the "over and above" projects.

But here is a reality. Faith Lutheran is not only a church it is a small business on a moderate size campus. So where do those "General" funds go?

Well—

- Our Building Mortgage
- Our Basic Missions commitment to District and Synod
- Utilities, upkeep, and supplies
- Salaries, and benefits for Pastor(s), Office Administration, Facilities Administration, Preschool Director/Teacher, Daycare Director, Music Coordinator(s)
- Education and Worship materials
- Projected campus improvements and capitol replacements

Yes, an annual budget of about \$680,000.00, that's what our Sunday offerings go toward.

Yet, opportunities and some unexpected and unbudgeted challenges come every year.

I have known pastors who screen much of this, but I have always felt

for the most part, you should decide this from your heart.

Here is an example of both.

A. **Broadcast Equipment**—The equipment by which we place our broadcast on Oahe Cable Channel 8 and on our website crashed. What makes this further complicated is that Oahe Cable Channel is going HD (high definition). So we must replace our equipment with a forward thinking vision in mind. So here was an "unexpected expense" for which we needed to appeal to the parish.

Thanks for helping us close the margin on this project.

B. **The Parmelee Sewing Project** Here was an unexpected opportunity to help a large mission project. Pastor Andrew Utecht and others have worked so hard for this "Hope Industries" project that is now known as "Harvest Winds Industries." What a flesh and blood outreach for our ministry in Rosebud and Parmelee and what an opportunity to provide helpful and meaningful employment with a textile project that actually has a market. Thanks, your pastors provided the challenge and opportunity. You chose and many, many of you have. We provided help to a promising project.

C. **The Holiday Meal Project** provides 350 holiday meals to low income families. While it is true our Board of Elders designated \$500.00 to both the Thanksgiving and Christmas meals from the Love Fund (thanks too for

your Love Fund gifts) we again give you the opportunity, if you choose, to donate a meal(s) to the community project. Giving forms can be found on the Oak Table in the Narthex. The deadline is December 10.

This is extraordinary giving—“over and above.” We tell of the opportunities and we let your heart and wallet decide.

YOU ARE SO GENEROUS!

And by the way, at the same time as all of this is going on, we are helping with fundraisers, for 36+ youth who are getting ready to attend the July 2016 Synod Youth Gathering, “In Christ Alone” in New Orleans.

That would bring this December 2014 A. D. Pastoral letter full circle right back to the Christmas greeting from our home to your home.

Christmas, it is the story of “God’s extraordinary” gift of Jesus Christ. It is about grace and mercy, it’s about more than we deserve, it’s about an extraordinary birth, an extraordinary Savior.

So thank you, thank you. For 40 years at Faith and 3 years at Bethesda and Zion—I was always saying thanks and this December is no different—Thank You!

Greetings in the Name of Jesus Christ, the Lord and Life of the Church! This month’s December Newsletter Article is all about (YOU)+H. I know what you are thinking. “Pastor Baumann, that’s confusing!” Well, let me help you out. This newsletter article is all about YOUTH! Or wait a minute.... Youth: There are so many wonderful youth activities happening in the life of our parish! The J.Y.M. Youth also got to experience an *Evening with the Doc.* event in September as we had Dr. Pepper ice cream floats, looked at some passages from the Gospel according to St. Luke (who by the way was a doctor-Colossians 4:14), and had the opportunity to have

Dr. Chris Stanley come speak to us about our bodies, and the truly incredible gift that they are. A number of our youth and families also participated in the Jason Gray concert which was held in Pierre on Nov. 9th and was hosted by KSLT. On the horizon is our Children’s Christmas program set for December 14th. Our N-3rd grade Sunday School classes will share with the congregation their program, *Hark the Herald Angels Sing*, at the 9:45 service on Dec. 14th and the 4th-8th grade Midweek program, *Comfort and Joy*, will be at the 11 o'clock service that day as well. Dress rehearsal for the N-3rd program is Saturday, Dec. 13th from 9:30-11, and the dress rehearsal for the 4th-8th grade program will be from 11:00-12:30 also that day. Our L.Y.F. High school group will be making and selling homemade Kuchen Sat. Dec. 13th and Sun., Dec. 14th as well.

A big thank you to our Board of Education, Rachel Aamold, our teachers, instructors, and to our accompanists for all their help and efforts with the Christmas programs! Our Midweek Aquatic Center pool party will be Wednesday, December 17th from 6:45-7:45 pm. Parents are asked to bring their children to and from the

Although we are still a ways out from the actual date of the gathering, which is July 16-20, 2016, our group has already begun the fundraising and promotional efforts for the gathering. There have been a number of fundraisers so far: a Sunday morning pancake breakfast, a biscuits and gravy breakfast, and a breakfast braid fundraiser. We have done really well on these fundraisers and we especially thank our Faith congregation for your help and support! We have already raised in the neighborhood of \$3,000 which will go toward funding the trip.

A Stitch in Time !

Our Pastors attended the Pierre Circuit Pastor's Conference on November 11 in Norris. It was the first time either of our Pastors had been through Norris and the first time at St. John's Lutheran of rural Norris.

Among our business, we learned the Sewing enterprise at Parmelee has its first contract and moves into its first phase of production for the Monday after Thanksgiving.

They head this new mission and employment opportunity and still need additional commercial sewing machines.


Once back in Pierre, our Pastors issued a challenge to the parish to join them in raising the \$3,000 needed for a machine.

The challenge: 100 family units at \$30. As you read this you might already know you met the challenge.

Yes, 100 family units at \$30. Even our Pastors' 7th and 8th grade Midweek classes joined in the challenge.

Once again, as a parish we saw a need, put our hands together and accomplished a task.

This time you might say we provided..."A stitch in time."



Building News

Debt Retirement—On November 1 we faithfully sent our regular monthly payment of \$5,395.00. Due to your continued generosity, we made:

- Advance payment #118
- Saved \$2,203.67 in interest

Thus far:

- We have saved \$475,209.92 in interest.
- We have reduced the principal of our \$1,000,000 loan to \$637,876.48.

A Challenge—We say it again, thank you for your gifts to Debt Retirement. By God's grace, we paid the 1961, the 1978, and the 1996 debt off early on our core facility.

By God's kindness, we were able to purchase and pay off 3 properties on the Euclid side of our block to extend our facility with the 2010 Christian Family Life Center.

By God's goodness, we were able to purchase the property of our Staff Apartment and the house where Pastor Baumann and family live.

Paying off debt has helped us to do projects that help others and projects that improve our campus.

A Challenge—One of our members, who believes in Debt Retirement, has offered a challenge. Starting November 30, Advent's First Sunday, through Christmas until December 31, this family is willing to match, dollar for dollar, every gift given to Debt Retirement up to \$10,000. So, looking for the end of the year generosity, here is a great opportunity for us to make continued progress with Debt Retirement.

Challenge on!

The Garage Project—It's taken three years to finally get to it, but finally some progress on this project.

We have poured the base of a two stall garage next to our current three stall garage. What goes into this garage? This two stall garage will be occupied by the Bobcat and its attachments, our large mower, the edger, fertilizer spreader, wheel barrow, tools, workbench, etc. An area dedicated to the equipment that our Facility Administrator uses to maintain our campus.

The resources for this comes from the extra monies we had when we raised gifts for the Bobcat, and monies given to the Building Fund. So we had dedicated monies to begin the project.


- ◆ By the way, the Bobcat has been a wonderful helpful investment. It assists with campus projects, and reduces outside vendors to handle our snow removal.

This project, the Lord willing, will be finished in the Spring.

What about the three stall garage? Good Question! It houses our two church vans, all the Circuit Bible equipment (tents, etc.) and our grills. We would desire to keep one bay open so when we have staff apartment guests (missionaries, guest speakers, etc.) they would have a place to put their vehicle and the materials they have brought to share with us.

Giving a Generous Percentage

God's Word tells us that not to give is a sin. *"Will a man rob God? Yet you are robbing Me. But you say 'How have we robbed you?' In your tithes and contributions"* (Malachi 3:8). If neglecting to give 10% in the Old Testament by God's believers was robbing God, what shall we say of us as New Testament Christians when we fail to give God as He has prospered us?

Giving a generous percentage of our incomes is a blow against selfishness and destroys the temptation of spending unwisely. It enables the Church to enlarge ministries as God directs. It makes giving a habit according to Biblical Principles, not merely an emotional expression. It is our expression of our love for our




