A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR URBACH

Greetings in our Lenten Lord!

“Return to the Lord, your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and abounding in steadfast love.”

These are words from Joel 2:13 which is a sung response to the reading of the Epistle in Divine Service Setting One.

They are words of invitation, words that call a believer to *Restoration and Renewal*.

In the life of the Christian Church Christmas and Easter stand out as two large, large moments. While there are certainly others, the birth and resurrection of Jesus are not only familiar moments they are also key to the Theology of our church.

Yet, I too find great joy in the preparation time for these two large celebrations—namely Advent and Lent.

Lent is upon us.

- Our Wednesdays will take us to New Testament texts. As we look at the brokenness of our fallen world we will be encouraged as we learn we are *“Restored in Christ”*.
- On Sundays we will look to the words of Isaiah, that mighty prophet of old, for words of *Restoration and Renewal* under the theme, *“Good and Perfect Gifts.”* I hope the *“Isaiah Call”*, which

will precede each sermon, will become meaningfully tucked in our mind. I too hope during the days of Lent we will learn a new Baptismal Hymn. Here is verse one of *“The Gifts.”*

“The gifts Christ freely gives He gives to you and me To be His Church, His bride, His chosen, saved and free! Saints blest with these rich gifts Are children who proclaim That they were won by Christ And cling to His Strong name.”

Among God’s gifts to us are the gifts of His grace and love which we celebrate. We celebrate it in frequent attendance at the Lord’s Supper. That is a part of the joy of being a member of faith. It is an important mark of our membership. We too, in keeping with the spirit of the Lord’s commandment, worship our Lord each week unless travel and the complications of busy schedules prevents that. This too is a mark of our membership. One could easily add that our service and support of our beloved congregation is an additional mark of our membership.

This brings me to the heart of the balance of Epiphany, through Lent into the remarkable Christian Festival of the Day of Resurrection our theme of concern and prayer is for

- The *Restoration* of those who no longer worship in our assembly of believers

- The *Renewal* for those who have become negligent in their worship habits

Restoration and Renewal—please come home to the House of the Lord.

“I was glad when they said unto me, ‘Let us go to the House of the Lord’”. Psalm 122:1

In a light-hearted manner we sometimes speak of C & E Christians, that is, Christmas and Easter Christians. How sad when C & E comes and even then we are no longer in God’s wondrous Sanctuary.

Here is a Psalm that we would hope resonates with every member of Faith.

“I love the House where you live, O Lord, the place where your glory dwells.” Psalm 26:8

Restoration and Renewal in the Sanctuary we love, that Holy place where we worship the Living Lord with the Assembly of believers, the beautiful house where His glory dwells.

Lent, a wondrous journey, a journey back home!

Are you ready for “March Madness?” No, I am not talking about NCAA college hoops, although I will be watching and cheering on my Wisconsin teams! I am talking about the penitential season of Lent, where we pause to reflect on our sin, our separation, and the wrath, anger, and “madness” God had stored up against us because of our great sin against Him.

On Good Friday, we see God’s full “madness” poured out onto His only Son, Jesus Christ, who atoned for the sin of the whole world (1 John 2:1-2). God the Father, fully and completely

turns His back on His only Son (Matthew 27:46), as there on the cross Jesus hung, and as there on the cross Jesus hung His head, breathed His last, and gave up His spirit (Matthew 27:50). It is truly “madness” and foolishness (1 Cor. 1:20-25) that God would go to such great lengths on the cross on Good Friday, and come through it all to the empty tomb on Easter Sunday to restore us, to show us love beyond measure. This hope is a now, but “not yet” reality for us. In the age to come, we will fully recognize the magnitude of what God has done for us (Revelation 5:6-14). So when

life hands you complete “madness,” think to that ultimate sacrifice of Jesus, and let that complete love move you into greater joy, greater strength, greater sacrifice, and greater appreciation for the God who loves you for all eternity, and for those you have been called to love. It’s madness!.... No wait, it’s just the amazing love of God!!!

It will be called the Holy Cross Landing. Most of Pastor Urbach's cross-


es will be arranged on the East wall.

Why Incense?

Exodus 40:5 *“Place the gold altar of incense in front of the ark of Testimony and put the curtain at the entrance to the tabernacle.”*

Psalms 141:2 *“May my prayer be set before you like incense; may the lifting up of my hands be like the evening sacrifice.”*

Ephesians 5:2 *“and live a life of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.”*

Revelation 8:3-4 *“Another angel, who had a golden censer, came and stood at the altar. He was given much incense to offer, with the prayers of the saints, on the golden altar before the throne. The smoke of the incense, together with the prayers of the saints, went up before God from the angel’s hand.”*

What’s the story with the incense? Perhaps you have been to a church that used incense. It creates some smoke that rises and has a sweet aroma.

The Altar of Incense is part of God’s command of what should be in the Tent of Meeting, then in the Temple and ultimately in the picture of Heaven itself.

King David, the writer of many Psalms, uses it as a visual of our prayers ascending to God Himself.

St. Paul speaks of it as a visual symbol and a very sense of smell as he likens our life as a fragrant offering.

Incense is a rich symbol instituted by Yahweh Himself as a sign of prayer, a sign of worship, a sign of devotion and dedication, and a very visible sign of our fellowship with Him.


Knowing the Scriptures, would it not be enjoyable to occasionally in worship have incense that would grant to our senses of sight and smell the delight of our fellowship and communion with God Almighty.

Reflect on the Scriptures and see if this might not be something we might do on occasion, especially on a communion Sunday in which we have a very real presence Fellowship with Christ Himself.

Give it some thought.



Lenten Key Cross




The heart of God's Love is found in the Cross and Resurrection.

After the first \$4,000.00 all Lenten offerings will go to the General Fund. How wonderful it would be if on Ash Wednesday we would come very close to meeting our goal.

Every month (except for February Annual Report and August) when you receive a Building Fund envelope you have two choices—

The first choice is Debt Retirement. Here is the February 1 update—

Thank you, in addition to our regularly scheduled February monthly payment of \$5,395.00, congregational gifts made it possible to send two additional advanced payments. What does this mean?

- We have made 103 advance payments.
- We have saved, since our

first scheduled payment in July of 2010, \$440,330.96 in interest.

- Our \$1,000,000 loan is now reduced to \$711,525.41.

Thank you, all of these gifts to Debt Retirement are gifts that have been given over and above our regular gifts.

Debt Retirement will be ongoing as we save significant interest.

On March 1 we will do our regular payment of \$5,395.00 You will notice that that amount consists of \$2,949.13 in principal and \$2,445.87 in interest. We will probably be able to do at least one advance payment (some months with special gifts we have done two and more).

As you see that would be # 64. We sent \$2,959.27 and we save the \$2,435.73. Why? Yes, why does it show payment 64 but we have done 104 advanced payments? The answer, this is our third amortization schedule due to a reduction of the interest rate of two occasions since our first July 2010 schedule.

The second choice is the Building Fund. Since there are ongoing projects on the campus, the Board of Stewardship has clarified what the Building Fund us used for:

The Building Fund will be used for all land and building improvements and future projects on the Faith Evangelical campus.

Thank you for your continued generous gifts to Debt Retirement and our Building Fund.

President's Mercy Grant Fund The South Dakota District



The Need: From time to time, professional church workers (pastors, Lutheran teachers, DCEs, etc.) experience extraordinary

or catastrophic circumstances which require financial resources that are not covered by their salaries or Concordia Plans benefits. When such circumstances occur, workers contact the District for assistance. The District sets aside contingency funds each year in our Work Program budget. However, these have proven not to be sufficient for meeting the large needs associated with extraordinary circumstances.

Patterned after Jesus' Mercy: Looking to Jesus who showed mercy upon those who experienced extraordinary situations

in their lives (Matt 9:27f; 9:35f; 14:14; 15:21f; 15:32f; 17:14f; 20:29f; etc.), the District's Board of Directors has established the "President's Mercy Grant Fund." This fund will be administered by the District President in consultation with the District's Executive Secretary and Vice-Presidents.

Partnerships: Congregations and circuits certainly wish to assist pastors or other professional workers when an extraordinary

or catastrophic situation arises. Sometimes, however, the need exceeds what a congregation or circuit can do. The President's Mercy Fund will partner with the congregation and circuit in providing assistance. In addition, Synod has an assistance program called "Soldiers of the Cross" to assist professional church workers. Grants from that fund are made only with participation by the worker's congregation or district, or both. Working in partnership as congregation, district, and Synod, help can be given.

Initial Funding: The initial goal is \$40,000. The District has provided a \$20,000 challenge grant from "Board Designated Funds." Approximately \$525 was received from the worship service offering at the Fall District Pastors' Conference. The remainder will come through donations from congregations and individuals within The South Dakota District. According to the fund guidelines, disbursements may not be made until the fund reaches its initial goal.

Ongoing Funding: A minimum balance of \$40,000 normally will be maintained. However, because unmet financial needs can be exceedingly great when an extraordinary or catastrophic circumstance occurs, we would like to see the balance far exceed the \$40,000 minimum. When distribution of Mercy Grants brings the balance below that amount, periodic appeals will be made for donations from congregations and individuals.

Grant Conditions: Applications for Mercy Grants will be considered after the worker has sought assistance from other available resources, including the worker's congregation. Mercy Grants to individual workers will be up to a total of one-half the balance of the fund. Initially, therefore, the maximum grant would be \$20,000. If the total balance of the fund exceeds \$40,000, the maximum Mercy Grant would still be up to one-half of the balance, depending on the circumstance. All Mercy Grants will include a portion with no expectation of repayment as well as a portion which the worker is to repay (without interest). Depending on the circumstances of the situation, the portion which the worker does not have to repay will be from fifty to ninety percent of the grant.
