## "Look At All Those Cows!..."

# Psalm 50:10 "...For every animal of the forest is mine and the cattle on a thousand hills."

My! Where has the summer gone?! Can you believe we are already into the fall? Gesh! Reflecting on my summer, it was a good one, and I hope yours was as well. I have to say, one of my summer joys is honestly, Sunday morning worship services, but I have also particularly enjoyed the numerous opportunities I've had to travel this summer.

Reflecting back, some of those great travel opportunities were: taking a group of our L.Y.F high school students tubing on the Niobrara one Saturday in July, leading our L.Y.F. on a day trip to Sky Zone Indoor Trampoline Park in Sioux Falls, and taking our 5<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> graders to the Black Hills in early June for the 6.2 mile Crazy Horse Volksmarch trip. One other trip from the past summer I really enjoyed was the canoe trip we did as a part of our J.Y.M. Circuit Bible Camp, which was held here in Pierre. because I always love seeing all the dairy cattle on the farms and in the countryside.

Even though I should know by now, I am always surprised by all the dairy cows I saw in Wisconsin, and also while I was at the Wisconsin State fair. There were even a good number driving through Minnesota, and then when we finally made it to South Dakota, I enjoyed seeing the beef cattle!! It was on our drive back home to Pierre that I got to do some reflecting on these magnificent critters. Cattle are remarkable animals! I'm driving along and the Holy Spirit drops this verse from Psalm 50 into my head: "Every animal of the forest is mine, and the cattle on a thousand hills!" And in SD what are there? ... If you said, "There are thousands of cattle on thousands of hills!" you'd be correct!

This is the picture God gives His covenant people. God. the creator of the universe—the One who made the heavens and the earth—owns it all! In Psalm 50 God tells the people, those cattle, the ones you use for sacrifices, they're not that special. In fact God says, "Pick out a thousand hills, I've got rights to every animal on those embankments!" The sacrifice of those animals is not what truly defines the relationship with Him. Good thing, or we'd be in trouble today. The climax of God's relationship to His people as the Creator of all things is found in verse 17 of Psalm 51. Psalm 51:17 reads, "The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit, a broken and contrite heart, O God you will not despise." God doesn't need anything from us. He uses silly cattle to make His point: It's all His!!! But what God does want is from us to live like: It's all His!!!

When we come before Jesus at the foot of the cross and at the empty tomb, we see that the One who made it all, also sacrificed it all. We see Jesus the Son of God, who is truly God Himself in the flesh, sacrificing it all for us! Truly incredible. We see the One who was emptied of His life, emptied of His glory, emptied completely for us. And as we stand there at the foot of Christ's cross. God wants us to come with a posture of worship—with hearts truly set in the right place. When we see God as Creator and us as creature, that truly changes things. "God, it's all yours. My relationship with my spouse is a gift from Your hand, and you call me to lovingly tend and care for that other person you've given me. My vehicles, they're yours God, how can I serve you with them? My anger, take it and replace it with things that come from your good and gracious hand. Fill me with love, joy, peace, and patience."

When we come to worship on Sunday mornings we receive only what God gives. We receive the forgiveness and love of Christ, along with a peace that passes all understanding, in the words and in the sacraments. It's all God's to give to us.

"Look at all them cattle on them there hills!" Cattle theology, who knew?! The Lord Jesus Christ bless you and preserve you as you serve Him and remember: "It's all God's." Every good and perfect gift comes from above. The Lord bless you, the Lord bless His Church, and the Lord bless the Gospel as it is shared and proclaimed from your hands and your mouth.


