### "Sent Forth By God's Blessing!"

When was I "Sent forth by God's Blessing?" Was it

- The day of my birth August 3, 1944, yes, I was a "war baby."
- The day of my Holy Baptism at Kountz Memorial Lutheran Church in Omaha, by the way years later at my Ordination we would borrow the Processional Cross from the church of my Baptism.
- The day I was confirmed on Palm Sunday 1958, at Bethany Lutheran in Omaha. I still have that hymnal.
- The day I was installed in my first parish, I only served two parishes in my public ministry.
- The day of my first Confirmation class May 21, 1972, yes I still have that hymnal as well.
- The day of my first marriage, the birth of my children Jonathan and Jennifer.
- The day I was installed at Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church where I have served for 41 years.
- The day I formally retired August 31, 2014 or remarried when Susan and I were married October 11, 2014.

Well, the answers—they are all yes.

Sent forth in birth and Baptism in all these public moments. Sent as a son, brother, confirmand, Pastor, husband, father, friend, community volunteer.

"Sent Forth by God's Blessing" will be our theme for this Fall into the summer of 2016. We will literally define every action of our parish as a "Sent Forth" moment.

It is based on the hymn, *Sent Forth By God's Blessing*. While the hymn was new for our church when it appeared in our, then new, hymnal "Lutheran Worship" (1982), it was certainly not a new hymn to God's Holy Church. It was written in the early 1900's and the words were penned to match a Welsh folk melody entitled "The Ash Grove."

It seems proper that it is the last communion hymn in the Communion section of Lutheran Service Book. It is a hymn designed to send us with joy and gladness back into our daily world that we might, "Give honor to Christ and His name that we bear."

We shall sing this hymn often in this next year, not just after Holy Communion but as a sending hymn, "To work for God's Kingdom and answer His call."

Personally, O hope we sing it enough that we might find ourselves singing it from memory.

"Sent Forth..." is not a pastor thing, it's a God thing—

Go make disciples of all nations baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey all I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always to the very end of the age. St. Matthew 28

So here we go—ready to be sent, not just every Sunday, but every day from the "rising of the sun to its setting the name of the Lord is to be praised." Psalm 113

"...Thus Far..." we are Sent Forth with God's Blessing.

### The Sound of the Big Rally

If there was one unmistakable sound *perishable*, and we will be we heard in Pierre, SD the summer of 2015, it was most certainly the rumble of motorcycles passing through. We all knew it was coming with the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally celebrating its 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary—an anticipated crowd of over 1 million people! In fact, as I type this article, I hear the unmistakable sound of motorcycles rumbling past the church campus. We pray their visit to our wonderful state was safe and most joyous!

There's another unmistakable sound in the Old Testament Scriptures that has rallied God's people together: that of the trumpet call. The people meet with God and Moses on Mt. Sinai in Exodus 19. The directive is given that only when the ram's horn sounds/ trumpets (Ex. 19:13) may the people go up to the mountain where God is. It is an interesting thing that God would actually lower Himself and descend on the mountain to meet with the people (sounds really parallel to what Christ would do!) The people know this is taking place when, as the text says, "the sound of the trumpet grew louder and louder" (Ex. 19:19). There is a great linkage of this trumpet sound rallying God's people together in both the Old and New Testaments. St. Paul writes about the rally that will take place at the sound of the last trumpet. In 1 Corinthians 15:51-52 St. Paul says, "Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed—in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imchanged." The unmistakable trumpet sound rallies those who have fallen asleep in Christ to new and everlasting life. The trumpet is a cry of victory for God's people. On Easter Morning we hear the trumpets in worship proclaiming Christ's victory over death!

So God's people rally. Every Sunday is a rally around the triumphant cross of Christ. Even the patriarch Jacob in Genesis 48:2 rallied. "When Jacob was told, 'Your son Joseph has come to you, 'Israel rallied his strength and sat up in bed." On September 13<sup>th</sup>, 2015 we're going to really *RALLY!* At the sound of joyous music, the giving of faithful Sunday School attendance awards, 2<sup>nd</sup> graders getting their Bibles; a blessing of the youth and their backpacks, for which we invite all the *youth* to bring their backpacks with them on September 13<sup>th</sup> to worship; commissioning and installation of Bible Study, Sunday School, and Midweek Teachers; the start of Sunday School classes beginning at 9:45 to 10:45 with signs posted where each classroom is located; a noon taco fiesta meal; along with games and a bounce house provided for by our board of Education! We rally because God in Jesus Christ is with us! God is with you. He will never leave you nor forsake you. We have the joyful promise of eternal life. So, join us on September 13<sup>th</sup> as

our God and as we worship His name. We are Sent Forth by God's Blessing. May God bless you at this rally, and on the Last Day at THEE BIG RALLY when we join with all the saints in heaven praising and glorifying His holy Name. What a day it will be!




# Join Con Brio Bells Bell Choir

#### TELLING THE STORY

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Acts 1:8

Stories – who doesn't like a good story? There are all kinds of stories, like fables. They teach us a simple life lesson – remember "The Tortoise and the Hare?" Hard work wins the race. There are countless stories from mythology, ballads about "Robin Hood," and the fairy tales penned by Hans Christian Anderson. Jesus used stories to teach the people. They were called parables... a little story with a big meaning. They can cut to the core because they are always true. We see ourselves in the wayward prodigal son, and also in the jealous brother. How many of us see ourselves in the Good Samaritan who came to the aid of his neighbor, but also identify with those who passed by? Have you been one of the guests who had no time for dinner? Or one of those fortunate people in the street who got a last minute invitation?

> I love to tell the story of unseen things above, Of Jesus and His glory, of Jesus and His love; I love to tell the story because I know 'tis true, It satisfies my longings as nothing else can do.

Kate Hankey was the daughter of a British banker and grew up in a stylish London suburb. She started Bible classes for girls in her neighborhood and at age eighteen, taught Bible classes for "factory girls." During a serious illness, she was ordered to rest and not teach Bible classes for a year. During that recovery, she wrote two hymns, "Tell Me the Old, Old Story," and "I Love to Tell the Story." Regaining her health, she went back to teaching Bible classes regularly and when she became too old to teach, she founded a prison ministry as a way to continue to tell the story of Jesus.

I love to tell the story –

'tis pleasant to repeat

What seems, each time I tell it,
more wonderfully sweet;
I love to tell the story,
for some have never heard
The message of salvation
from God's own holy Word.

Phillips Brooks was a mighty preacher who served Episcopal congregations in Philadelphia and Massachusetts. Five months following President Lincoln's assassination, the Reverend, seeking peace and healing during our traumatized nation's fear and uncertainty, penned "O Little Town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie." Even today, when headlines cause unrest and angst, the story of Bethlehem calms, reassures, and changes lives.

Stories connect us to each other and to the collective consciousness. We share them in our devotions. We tell them in our music. It reminds us of the blessings we continually receive from God. And

that's the real story. God the Creator. God who saved us and gave us eternal life. God the Spirit, who fills us with peace, strength, hope and love, that no one and nothing can take away. God wants us to sing, to share the story – in times of sickness, despair and mourning, and in times of great joy. It brings us closer together, it brings healing, it reminds us of the gifts we've been given and reminds us of how to show love to each other. And that brings us closer to God. Send us forth, Lord, as willing and joyful storytellers!
