Friday evening worship service is at 7:00 pm and is open to the community. Over the 2 days we will have wonderful speakers, service events, and the opportunity to bring Gifts from the Heart.

We will have two projects for our Gifts from the Heart. Harvest Winds LLC on the Rosebud Reservation at Parmalee has been operating for well over a year sewing articles for sale to the general public. One of their projects is sewing star quilts. According to Pastor Andrew Utecht they always need GOOD quality cotton quilting fabric and other sewing supplies. This will be one of our projects for our Gifts from the Heart. Quilting fabric may be of any SOLID color of good quality 100% cotton and at least two yards in length. You may also purchase a bolt of the quilting fabric. If you wish, you may furnish material for the backing of larger quilts in WHITE or OFF-WHITE only. The wider backing is made in either 90" or 108" widths. You would buy 2 1/2 yards of either width. They can also use the 3000 yard cone thread in white, off-white, or light tan colors.

The second project is items for the Pierre Food pantry. You may purchase non-perishable food items and paper products for the Pierre Food Pantry.

The man who runs his motorized scooter to get to the garage at my apartment knew that I was the pastor at "Urbach's Church." He goes to Memorial, I think is what he said, but could not remember the name "Faith." Others have identified Faith by certain events held here, as if one activity or another defined our being.

It is a basic question. Who does the congregation belong to and why is it here? A

fundamental question.
Does it belong to one segment or another to do this thing or that?
Do decisions get made to please on the basis of only this or that aspect?

Might I suggest that we do best when we agree that it is Jesus' church and that all of it (and each of us) belong to him. There is a relationship in being owned, in belonging. And a comfort (though I expect my car does not really much care).

If we are Jesus' church then decisions made involve him, first, last, and along the way.

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

This short prayer happened to catch my eye the other day.

Holy One,
Untamed by the names
I give you,
in the silence name me,
that I may know who I am,
that I may hear the truth
you put into me,
that I may trust the love
you have for me.
You call me to live out this
love with my sisters
and brothers in your
human family.
Amen.

As I see it, that's an honest admission of human failing, one that goes back to the Garden of Eden: to manage God, to tame Him and put Him in a box, to create Him in an image of our choice. But, there are other reasons to assign names to God. Names help us understand the nature of God, and identify different aspects of His divinity. The Scriptures and our hymnody provide a rich vocabulary full of images, notions, names and adjectives ascribed to God.

We often sing these names in our hymns and choral literature – Maker of Heaven, our Refuge, the God of Jacob, Creator, Shepherd, a Present Help, God of Grace and Glory, Emmanuel, Living Word, Beautiful Savior, the Alpha and the Omega, our Shelter, the Lamb, Heavenly Father, Blessed Lord. The names for God that resonate with us are predicated by our needs at the present time. To the homeless, God is a shelter; to the farmer he is Lord of the Harvest; to a addict, he might be a deliverer; to one who mourns, God is a comforter; to a child, he is a loving father.

We never know what words of assurance people need when they come to worship or listen to the choir. We know that we have a message in our music, and that message will resonate differently with everyone according to their needs. The message in our music invites an expanded understanding of God—that He is alive and untamed!

Know, too, that God knows our names! "I call you by

name, you are mine," says
God in the book of Isaiah.
What a powerful message of
belonging! We are claimed
and loved! To be claimed in
love is powerfully life-giving
We are sealed by the Holy
Spirit and marked as Christ's
own forever!

***Of interest, I dug a little deeper, and found that the above prayer is from a book entitled, GUERRILLAS OF GRACE: PRAYERS FOR BATTLE. It is a collection of "tough, beautiful and earthy prayers" when there are no words for the pain of life.

Little Dresses For Africa

Little Dresses for Africa is a Christian organization reaching out to 47 countries in Africa, 31 other countries and even the Appalachians and South Dakota in the USA. These dresses go out as little ambassadors in the name of Jesus to give hope to the children who receive them. The simple pillowcase dresses are distributed through orphanages, churches and schools to instill in the hearts of little girls that they are worthy!

Mission teams from the United States personally deliver a majority of the dresses to girls giving them hope and touching their lives in Jesus' name.

Little Dresses for Africa is a mission outreach for our Faith Lutheran LWML. During February and March volunteers met Monday nights or one afternoon a week to cut pillowcases and assemble kits to be sewn into dresses. The kits are available for anyone to take home to sew and add their own personal touches to the dresses. They are then displayed on the narthex wall.

The LWML thanks everyone who has contributed pillowcases, bias tape, elastic, ribbon, decorative trim, buttons, thread or cash for incidentals or shipping. The LWML appreciates your donations, time and talents, and your support. THANK YOU! THANK YOU!

Around 200 kits have been com-

pleted. Many others have been donated that were not in kits. Total numbers will be in the bulletin after the dresses have been counted, packed, and shipped. Last year 256 little dresses were sent.

This is a wonderful opportunity for all of us to support the sanctity of human life by blessing men, women and children in crisis situations with gifts of diapers and baby wipes. L Georgia K for the Diaper Derby Box! Your past generosity has been greatly appreciated and has positively impacted many lives in our community! We are hoping to surpass last year's total of 3,000 diapers and wipes collected!

2016 Legislative Summary:

As reported last month, the South Dakota Legislature passed important pro-life legislation known as <u>SB72</u>, which protects paincapable unborn children from abortion after 20 weeks gestation. Thankfully, three other pro-life bills became law in the 2016 session:

<u>HB1157</u> requires an abortionist to inform the pregnant mother that her unborn child could be saved

even after taking the first pill in a drug-induced abortion procedure, should she choose not to take the second pill to complete the abortion.

HB1123 requires the Department of Health to post on their website the dates and results of inspections of abortion facilities.

SB24 prohibits the sale and transport of fetal body parts.

We thank and praise God for these new protections for His unborn children!

Jacob Shoup in Concert at Faith



2016 Food Drive: Over A TON of Food!

FOOD DRIVE

The congregation of Faith Lutheran Church has once again shown tremendous generosity during the annual gathering of food for the Pierre-Ft. Pierre Food Pantry.

During the month of March, the congregation brought 2,085 pounds of food items and paper products to the church. That was 300 items more than last year. In addition, members of the congregation gave cash and checks totaling a record \$14,337.50 to the Pantry in conjunction with this year's Food Drive, more than double the amount of financial contributions received last year. The Pierre Area Referral Service staff was speechless when we told them about the financial contributions.

On April 4, several members of the congregation used Al Meier's super-sized trailer to haul **128 boxes** from the church to the Food Pantry, which is housed at the Boys and Girls Club. Total number of items: **an even 2,000.**


Among the items collected this year:

282 cans and packages of soup, chili, and stew208 cans of vegetables

- 189 cans of tuna, chicken, and other canned meat
- 163 boxes of macaroni and cheese
- 98 cans and bags of beans
- 97 boxes of cereal and oatmeal
- 97 boxes of Hamburger Helper, Tuna Helper, Chicken Helper and Homestyle Bakes
- 86 boxes of potato mixes
- 86 bags and boxes of dry pasta
- 85 cans of fruit
- 78 cans and jars of spaghetti sauce, tomato sauce and tomato paste
- 76 cans and boxes of pasta meals
- 53 bags and boxes of rice and rice mixes
- 41 boxes of crackers
- 37 boxes of cake mix
- 25 boxes of pancake mix

Men's Softball






