

"The Word and the Cross"

Welcome back to our regular monthly look at the stained glass windows in our beautiful sanctuary. We pick back up with the next window. This one shows us the reason why we gather in that sanctuary: the cross and God's Word. We will look at how these two work together.

The cross is slightly hidden behind God's Word. This positioning is appropriate. Without the insight of God's Word, the cross of Christ is hidden. Through God's Word, we are equipped to see our Savior. This is the ultimate reason for us gathering together: learning and trusting in our Lord Jesus Christ.

We gather for the cross. Our Lord has given his life as a sacrifice for us. Because he died, we live. Through his death and resurrection, we obtain forgiveness for our sins, we have his promise of eternal life, and we are saved. Every time we see the cross, we remember the love that Jesus showed to us in willingly giving up his life.

How do we hear and learn about this wonderful news? Through God's Word. John's gospel tells us, "These are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." The things which are recorded in God's Word have been written for our benefit. As we hear, read, study, and learn, we understand and appreciate what our God has done for us. Apart from these inspired words, we could not possibly know what the cross means for us.

But these words are not meant only for us. Behind both the cross and God's Word are rays of light pouring outwards. These words, the message of our Savior's love, should be shared with all people. God's Word points us to the cross. The cross shows us the blessings that Jesus gives to us. Then we look out at our friends and neighbors. We can share God's Word with them. We can relate, in our own unique ways, what God has done for us and what he desires to do for them too. Then the cycle continues. These new people hear God's Word and find peace and salvation in the cross of Jesus Christ.

This window depicts the reason for us gathering together: through God's Word, we hear and know what our Savior has done and continues to do for us. The next time that you are in our beautiful sanctuary, look for this window and remember the cycle: from God's Word to the cross, and from the cross to sharing with others. See you next time.

LIFE IN THE CITY

"Then Jesus began to denounce the cities in which most of His miracles had been performed, because they did not repent."

Matthew 11:30

A number of years ago, my now-deceased husband and I, along with a group of friends, boarded a flight to New York City to enjoy Broadways shows, good food, shopping and the Yankees. Frank Sinatra was right on when he sang about the city that never sleeps. New York is awash in color, texture, sights, sounds and smells. Steel, concrete, glass and bright lights. A sea of yellow taxicabs, tour buses, street vendors and marquees. It is a true melting pot of humanity and ethnicity.

Where cross the crowded ways of life, Where sound the cries of race and clan, Above the noise of selfish strife, We hear thy voice, O Son of Man.

From the time we deplaned at LaGuardia, until we reboarded a week later, there was a continual din; the clatter and racket of machinery, the babble of foreign tongues, the roar of traffic, the air shattered and punctuated by the constant squeal of sirens and horns. The city has its own rhythm, energy, commotion, clamor and hubbub. Crowded streets, crowded stores. Crowds everywhere.

In haunts of wretchedness and need, On shadowed thresholds dark with fears, From paths where hide the lures of greed, We catch the vision of Thy tears.

If Christ were to walk the streets of the city today, what would He think of it all? Would He find our lives crowded? Our crowded calendars? Our minds crowded? What would He see on the street corners and the alleys? Would he find "wretchedness and need?" Would He see "restless throngs?" The helpless? The hopeless? The homeless? The hungry? The haughty? Everyone hurrying to work? Hurrying to get home? Hurrying to fill empty lives? Would He hear racial slurs? Would He hear "noise of selfish strife?" Angry voices? Frenzied music?

O Master, from the mountain side, Make haste to heal these hearts of pain; Among these restless throngs abide, O tread the city's streets again

Interestingly, the hymnwriter, Frank Mason North (1850-1935), was a New York City man. He was asked to pen a hymn on a missionary theme for the Methodist hymnal. He wrote about New York

City as he saw it in 1903: That of being a great mission field. Then, as now, a challenge to bring Christ's presence to the weak, the disabled, the inept, the greedy, the desperate, the downtrodden, the feeble and the forlorn.




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Forever Young

Forever Young is a group of 55 and older, retired or semi-retired folks who get together the third Thursday of each month for fellowship and great food. Please join us!




Men's Fellowship
