"In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one...and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God" (Eph 6:16-17). Our window this month focuses our attention on the Christian life. How are we to live as Christ's redeemed people? What guidance does our Savior give us as we navigate the many challenges of life? This month's window points us in the right direction.

As you read through more of Ephesians 6 (and I encourage this), St. Paul lists many different pieces of armor that God gives us. This month we'll focus on two, since the window so beautifully depicts them: the Spirit and the shield. The sword of the Spirit, or the Word of God, is one of our defensive tools. The shield of faith is another one.

Although a sword might bring images of aggression and attack, it does not necessarily apply to the Christian life. I picture the use of the sword as defensive, as if you are deflecting and parrying the blows of the opponent. This usage falls more in line with the rest of the armor, especially the shield. God gives us his Word and faith, two spiritual tools that work together in wonderful harmony. The one strengthens the other. As you hear God's Word, your faith and trust in Christ grows. As that faith increases, it drives you continually back to God's Word to learn more about the merciful and loving deeds of your God.

The reason for these defensive tools is the spiritual battle that we fight. Earlier in chapter 5, St. Paul reveals our enemy: the devil and all his evil spiritual allies. Christ has already defeated them in his death and resurrection. Even though their end has come, they are still allowed some room to threaten and intimidate. On our own, we would easily fall victim to the devil's lies. But God gives us his armor to deflect all incoming attacks. With God's Word and faith, we can repel the devil's advances.

What happens if you slip up and allow an arrow to hit its target? This happens throughout our lives. We make choices which are not pleasing to God. The devil leads us into temptation and we sin. In these times, we remember the loving mercy of God: we are his forgiven children. Even though we make mistakes and sin, God gives us his forgiveness. He heals the injury that the devil's arrow has created; God readies us to continue our defensive stand. One day we will lay down this armor and stand in the peace and beauty of eternal life. In that place, the devil will no longer attack, and we will not need our tools of defense. But until that day, we remain vigilant.

When heaven touches earth, something is going to change. Shepherds in the field witnessed angels descending, and they fell into great fear. Being startled may have had something to do with it, but like us, they were not holy and worthy to stand in the presence of the Holy One. By our own accord, we are not sinless and something within us knows we have no right to stand before the perfectly holy.

> Out in space Away from the earth There is no horizon No line of reference To shape and orient the rays of sun as they slip into view. No dawning as we know it. A horizon is a planetary phenomenon. It is an earthly occurrence. Heavens and earth seem well separate and established by the horizon. Well divided and apart by that imaginary line. From our viewpoint it is so hard to see, so hard to imagine, that earth is in the heavens, that earth is part of the heavens. Perhaps it would take the power that made them to know that heaven and earth can come together in the same space. (Welcome, Holy Child.)

As a musician, I love this poem/psalm/lyric by Susan Palo Cherwien. It helps the eye of the reader; matches the cadences of speech; and allows for pauses and breathing. I love the imagery, too, as well as the fact that something special is happening.

When December approaches, I cannot help but think back on some past Decembers, when I was downhearted and cheerless. Yet, when heaven and earth came together, and I pondered the great news of the shepherds, I felt the rough places that were draining me of energy and joy were smoothing themselves out.

When I was a freshman in high school, a member of our close-knit class of 50 was killed in a car accident a couple of weeks before Christmas. It was my first experience with the death of someone close to me. It was the topic of conversation everywhere in town - from the classroom and on the street, to area businesses and houses of worship. Our school Christmas concert was just days away - something we had all looked forward to, but now our hearts were no longer in it. I don't exactly remember what our director said, but it was the way he said it. The concert was dedicated to the memory of Ann; there was candlelight and Christmas trees, and above all there was the music - glorious, comforting, uplifting, a reminder that heaven and earth had come together.

Years later, my Grandmother passed away two days before Christmas. Her funeral was two days after Christmas. My brother and I were her only grandchildren, and when we lived at home, we saw her on a near-daily basis. She was our cheerleader and we were close. She was a widow for many more years than she was a wife, and a wonderful servant of the Lord – well into her 90's. My heart ached. On the afternoon of

the viewing, our small family gathered at the funeral home. For some unknown reason, my five-year -old niece (who eventually became a Minnesota State Champion Gymnast) decided to turn a few cartwheels up the aisle toward the coffin. My mother was aghast; my brother and his wife smirked; I snickered; and my husband said, "I'm sure your grandma wouldn't mind." Grandma's funeral service was a Christmas celebration, complete with lights and trees, and our pastor delivered a message that God calls all of us by name and gave us the best gift of all when heaven and earth came together.

Three years ago in December, my husband was called to his eternal home. After battling cancer for nearly eight years, it wasn't unexpected; but I felt like a piece of myself was gone, too. Through the comfort of my church family – those who arrived at the house with food, encouraging words and memorials, to the special friend who showed up with a meaningful devotion – I knew heaven and earth had come together. I immersed myself in the music of the season – after all, I accompanied the Riggs and GMMS choirs at their concerts within the next week, and preparations for our worship services continued. Jesus, the only sinless one, would make us holy so we could stand before God without fear, and feel the utter joy of Emmanuel's presence and enable us to rejoice!



Fed By Faith

Fed by Faith, formerly referred to as the Love Kitchen, will be actively starting in January 2022 to prepare meals for congregants and family members in need. These meals will consist of a frozen entrée that can easily be reheated in the oven or the stovetop, or microwave if thawed; frozen vegetables; canned, jarred or fresh fruit; buns/breads; and bars/cookies. These are meant to be used at times when someone has an illness or recovering at home, a new baby or a death in the family, or just a general need.

The ministry is based on Matthew 25:35-36 and will be used to share God's love through nourishment of body and faith. The congregation can be helpful by notifying Nancy Shoup at 280-2091 or call the church office regarding those who can be served by the ministry. This ministry will only be successful if we are aware of those in need and are provided with those names.

Members may also bake at home and divide cookies or bars in portions of a dozen and place in a freezer bag. These can be brought to the church office and placed in the dedicated freezer in the kitchen. It is requested you not use nuts or peanut butter in your baked goods, but if you do, they must be properly labeled to indicate that fact. If you desire monetary assistance regarding the preparation of those bars/cookies please let Nancy know and that can be arranged.

We pray God's blessing on this ministry as we move forward to serve our Lord through Word and action. Thank you!

Our Curriculum Themes are:

November 29th-December 10th: Hot Cocoa and Penguins. We created a bunch of center activities based around this theme and found a few awesome Christian-based penguin and hot cocoa discussions and activities. We will be sipping hot cocoa during one activity while talking about how God's love mixes into us – like candy canes in hot chocolate. As God's children, you are taught in the Bible about the importance of giving. God gave the world the best and biggest gift possible when He gave the world His Son Jesus.

Scripture tells us how, on that Christmas day more than two thousand years ago, the angels, shepherds, and wise men all gave. The angels gave Jesus the gift of music as they told the world of Jesus' birth through their songs, the shepherds left their flocks to give honor to baby Jesus, and the wise men brought Jesus gifts of gold, incense, and myrrh.

The wise men brought Jesus gifts but before presenting their gifts they first gave Him honor through the giving of themselves. Matthew 2:10-11 says, "When they saw the star they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. And going into the house they saw the Child with Mary His mother, and they fell down and worshiped Him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered Him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh." Before you give God your quarters or dollars, do what the Wise Men did first. They knew who Jesus wan, and they thanked Him for coming to us. This is the meaning of stewardship. God wants your praise and adoration.
