"The Alpha and the Omega"

The features of our window for this month are some of the most straightforward that we have seen. The Greek letters "Alpha" and "Omega" are prominently positioned in the window. These letters are used three times in the Book of Revelation. Interestingly, two of these times the title is used in a way that we would associate it with the Father, and the third time the title is given to Jesus. We'll investigate the title on its own and then see why it is given to both Father and Son.

"'I am the Alpha and the Omega,' says the Lord God, 'who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty." [Rev 1:8]. The use of these two Greek letters, alpha and omega, symbolize the beginning and the end. For us English speakers, we could hear something like "A" and "Z," but the effect is the same. God follows the use of these letters with words further expressing his eternal nature. He was, he is, and he is to come. It is especially difficult for us to even begin understanding the eternality of God. He existed before time. He continues to exist, and he will exist in eternal life with us. There was no "when" or "how long" in the beginning. We have no way of talking about it that does not include some concept of time. God simply was, he is, and he is to come.

"He who was seated on the throne said... 'It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end." [Rev 21:5-6]. Now we come to the transitional phrase. This time the title could arguably apply to either the Father or to Jesus. The next verse sounds suspiciously like something Jesus told the woman at the well (John 4). Yet the one on the throne is often times the Father. Reading the third use will help us. "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end...I, Jesus" [Rev 22:13, 16]. The third time the title is unquestionably applied to Jesus. He stresses that it is he himself talking. What we have said about the Father applies just as much to Jesus and to the Holy Spirit. They are all three our one God. The Father was, Jesus was, the Spirit was. All three persons continue to be, and they will exist forever.

Ultimately, the ambiguity helps in our conception of God. We do not muddle the three persons, thinking that one is another. Each remains their own unique person. Yet they all together possess the same qualities. Applying the title first to the Father, then in a transitional way, then finally to Jesus helps us to see the cohesive nature of God. Such a rich depth of knowledge is contained in two Greek letters. Come back next month as we continue to investigate the beautiful windows of our sanctuary.

"For no one can lay any foundation other than the one that has been laid; that foundation is Tesus Christ." I Corinthians 3:11

Recently, a friend sent this note to me:

When parents get old: Let them grow old with the same love that they let you grow... let them speak and tell repeated stories with the same patience and interest that they heard yours as a child... let them overcome, like so many times when they let you win... let them enjoy their friends just as they let you... let them enjoy living among the objects that have accompanied them for a long time, because they suffer when they feel that you tear pieces of this life away... let them be wrong, like so many times you have been wrong, and they didn't embarrass you by correcting you... LET THEM LIVE and try to make them happy the last stretch of the path they have left to go; give them your hand, just like they gave you their hand when you started your path. "Honor your mother and father and your days shall be long upon the earth."

That hit home for me. My parents are old. They're 95 and were moved from assisted living to longterm care not that long ago. I've made the seven-hour drive to see them fairly often the last several months. My brother and I have had to make some difficult decisions regarding their care, as well as with all the contents of the 70 year-old house we were raised in. Both parents have dementia. We are all on quite a journey.

My folks did so well for so long, and now, suddenly, they were both declining rapidly. They know us, but Dad is confused a lot of the time. The last time I was home, he asked about a number of his relatives – who are all deceased. I assured him they were all well and safe. One day he was wearing Mom's hearing aids. He was obsessed with taking us out for a meal and didn't understand he would be eating in the dining room. He has no short-term memory, so I do my best to talk farming and trucks with him. I still think of a man who worked very hard to provide for his family and lived his faith.

Mom is very fragile and is in hospice care. She is weak, but her eyes lit up when we walked into her room. She was a strong woman and literally stood behind me when I was practicing my piano lessons. She saw to it that I learned my memory work for Sunday School and Catechism classes. She and I butted heads frequently when I was a teenager. Admittedly, I liked to "push the envelope" a bit and grumbled when she said "No." I just wanted to have fun and be like everyone else. Dad would always say, "Remember who you are." They both recited the "Lord's Prayer" and Mom said she was looking forward to being with Jesus. It's so obvious their faith foundation hasn't left them, even though their bodies are feeble and weakened.

We will all grow old, and the "firm foundation of our youth" will eventually be crumbling all around us. God understands aging; he is older than creation. He can calm our anxious fears and help us renew the "firm foundation" of our faith in Him. It is comforting to know that He holds our future in His loving hands.

This is a wonderful class for everyone that covers the basic teachings of our church and helps you understand what makes us Christian and specifically Lutheran as well.


This is an especially important class for those who are new with us and who would desire to become a part of our Faith Family.
