

CLEANSING FOUNTAIN

"God, be merciful to me a sinner!".... Luke 18:13B

My dad, my brother and I, and our families finally said our last good-bye to Mom on June 10. We had delayed the funeral service from February due to schedules and winter weather, making it difficult for my dad to attend. Delaying the service gave me some time to think and plan; we had done the same for my husband's memorial service. Mom had most of her service planned out; the Scripture readings, the hymns, the solo she wanted Rodd to sing, and... the sermon text: "God, be merciful to me a sinner."

I'll have to admit, I couldn't figure out why Mom wanted that text. It wasn't her confirmation verse, and it struck me as a rather unusual verse for a funeral sermon. But I gave all the information Mom had written down to Pastor Lee. The verse, from Luke 18, is from one of the parables where Jesus contrasts the attitude of two men – a Pharisee and a tax collector. We are all familiar with the story. The Pharisee boasted about what a good and righteous person he was, whereas the tax collector humbled himself saying, "God, be merciful to me a sinner."

Ever since by faith I saw, I saw the stream Thy flowing wounds supply, Redeeming love has been my theme, and it shall be till I die.

When Pastor Lee began his sermon, he commented that in 33 years of ministry, he had preached hundreds of funeral sermons, but never one on that verse. He went on to talk a little about Mom, saying she was a student of the Bible and loved the Word. "But," he went on to say, "Eileen was a sinner." We are all sinners. The text is a plea for mercy, and the tax collector calls himself a sinner. Mercy is a quality that has to do with compassion, forgiveness, and maybe some leniency when asking for forgiveness. God is the "Father of mercies and the God of all comfort." God is rich in mercy, and His mercy is connected to His love. Healing mercy is related to His great compassion for us — His suffering, sinful children. "Sinner" and "mercy." Two key words.

Thinking about Mom's instructions for her funeral service, I decided to add another solo and have Rodd also sing, "There Is a Fountain." I thought it went well with the sermon text. Sung to an early American tune, "CLEANSING FOUNTAIN," it acknowledges the great sacrifice Jesus made for our salvation. The poetry was written by Englishman William Cowper in the 1700's. He was a contemporary of John Newton, who penned "Amazing Grace." I have heard a couple of Black Gospel Choirs perform "There Is a Fountain." Black choirs sing with passion. When they sing in their slow, expressive groove style, the text comes alive. The intense visual of Jesus' flowing wounds and sinners plunging beneath the flood recalls the amazing power of mercy and forgiveness.




July and August Events!


