



Yet in Thy Dark Streets Shineth

Christmas preparations are going strong. Our retail stores are offering all sorts of Christmas themed decorations and plenty of tempting items to purchase (they have had such things out for quite a while now). Maybe your tree is already up or it might be at the top of the "to-do" list. Family plans have been set or are being ironed out. You might be out on the road this Christmas battling the snow and wind to make it to your destination. Join us each Wednesday night at 7:00PM, beginning December 6, as we travel to various cities in Israel: Nazareth, Jerusalem, and Bethlehem. In each of these cities, God is at work unfolding his master plan of salvation.

God will send his angel Gabriel to visit a young woman named Mary. She will hear the most unprecedented news in the history of creation: "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy—the Son of God." God will take upon himself human flesh. Jesus, God's Son, will be born in the same way as the rest of us. This ordinary young lady from a forget-table town will give birth to the most miraculous baby: Jesus Christ, God and man.

Our journey will then take us to the city of Jerusalem. So much of Israel's history happens in and around Jerusalem. A good portion of Jesus' ministry, as well as the week preceding his death, will occur in this town. Yet the angel Gabriel appears to an elderly man named Zechariah. He promises, in words strikingly similar to Mary's message, that Zechariah's wife Elizabeth will bear a son. While not quite as miraculous (there is only one God-man, Jesus), this child is no less spectacular. Well beyond the years of bearing children, God will simultaneously fulfill a longstanding desire of this couple and prepare the way for his Son. Their son, John, will "make ready for the Lord a people prepared."

During our third week, we travel to Bethlehem. The ancestral home of King David, God's people waited for centuries without anyone nearing David's devotion to God, his wisdom to rule, and his prowess in battle. Even David himself knew about the Greater One promised, speaking prophetically in Psalm 110, "The Lord says to my Lord: 'Sit at my right hand, until I make your enemies your footstool.'" David calls him Lord, yet he is David's son. The baby, promised to all God's people and specifically revealed to Mary, is the King of kings and Lord of lords. We welcome this child each Christmas as the one who rules all things in heaven and on earth, the light of the world, Jesus Christ.

I hope that you travel with me as Christmas Day approaches. Our time in these three cities will help to see God's plan at work in the history of the world as well as his continued work in our lives.

ALL IS CALM

Finding Light in Unexpected Places

And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying:

"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!" Luke 2:13 & 14

We expect inspiration in sunsets, ocean views and fields of South Dakota sunflowers. In turn, we don't expect to find it in the tragic, mundane, depressing or ordinary events in our lives. Certainly, smelly, humble and lowest-of-the-low shepherds, who were tending sheep in the dark fields outside of Bethlehem, didn't expect the sky to explode with light and reveal multitudes of the heavenly host singing praises to God.

Silent night, holy night! All is calm, all is bright round yon virgin mother and child. Holy Infant, so tender and mild, sleep in heavenly peace, sleep in heavenly peace.

Recently, the Pierre Players presented the musical, "All is Calm," a production based on the true story of the Christmas Truce of 1914. The narrative takes place on Christmas Eve of World War I, when soldiers of the British Expeditionary Force heard German troops in opposite trenches across the Western Front singing carols and patriotic songs. Messages began to be shouted between trenches. In an impulsive, but courageous move, British and German soldiers laid down their arms, met in "No Man's Land" and exchanged gifts of rum, candy and tobacco; took photos; buried casualties; repaired trenches, and played an impromptu game of football. The events are based on letters, photos, interviews, journals, and official war documents from the Imperial War Museums.

It is a story of the power of peace in time of war, where barbed wire kept soldiers in their place. The young heroes spent days and nights in three-foot deep, dark, muddy trenches, shivering in the muck and trying to keep warm. They experienced an endless cycle of sleeplessness, fear, stale food and cigarettes too wet to light. "No Man's Land" was the barbed-wire area that separated the armies. On December 7, 1914, Pope Benedict asked the High Commands on both sides that "...guns may fall silent

at least upon the night the angels sang." His plea was officially ignored. The spontaneous ceasefire was relatively small scale, haphazard and entirely unauthorized, but a welcome break from the hell of war.

Silent night, holy night! Shepherds quake at the sight; Glories stream from heaven afar. Heav'nly hosts sing, Alleluia! Christ, the Savior is born! Christ the Savior is born!

When we celebrate Christ's birth, there is a sense of renewal that connects us to the roots of our faith. The simple shepherds and the homesick soldiers witnessed a burst of light in unforeseen circumstances. Wherever you are, whatever is happening, whatever thoughts might be racing through your mind, light could be just around the corner. Christ is the Light of the World. Even in dark times, the Light is available.

Silent night, holy night! Son of God, love's pure light, radiant beams from Thy holy face; With the dawn of redeeming grace, Jesus, Lord at Thy birth, Jesus, Lord, at Thy birth.



All men of our Parish are invited to our Men's Christmas Fellowship.


Our gathering is on Monday, December 4 at 7:00 p.m. In the Living Room.


