Palm Sunday, April 2, 2023 at 6:30 PM

The Last Supper will come alive at Faith Lutheran on Sunday, April 2 in a dramatic musical experience presented by members of the Faith Lutheran Congregation and the Faith Choir.

"The Living Last Supper" is a live re-enactment of the classic mural painting by Leonardo da Vinci. It portrays the night in which Jesus and His disciples gathered in the upper room on the eve of the crucifixion. It is where Jesus ate one final meal with His closest companions, and where He revealed that one of them will betray Him before the night is over. We will hear from each of the disciples, and listen to the story from their perspective. The choir will offer several inspirational anthems.

Following the presentation, there will be an opportunity for light refreshments and fellowship.

"The Changing Seasons"

I had a thought, as I was growing up, about celebrating Easter. "Wouldn't it be more meaningful," Little Sam thought, "to celebrate Jesus' milestones as he lived them?" We would pick a year to celebrate Christmas. Then, thirty-three years later (since we think Jesus was thirty-three when he died), we would celebrate Holy Week: Palm Sunday, Good Friday, and Easter. This would make those holidays more meaningful.

Maybe it would. But losing the annual celebration would be more tragic. In my desire to impart additional meaning to these celebrations, I had (ironically) forgotten how forgetful humans can be. When we are not reminded of a thing, we forget pretty quickly. After a year, how well do you remember something? After thirty-three years, the memory is pretty much gone. We need the annual celebration to remind just as much to rejoice.

The Church seasons (Lent, Easter, Pentecost, Advent, etc.) help us remember. We highlight the big milestones in our Lord's earthly life. We join him as he performs ordinary actions (although I hardly think any of them could be ordinary): healing, feeding, and teaching. The ordinary leads us into the special. The special punctuates what appears ordinary. The miracles of feeding lead us into Maundy Thursday, where Jesus institutes communion. His resurrection on Easter receives a small reminder as we gather each time to worship.

Living in a place with all four seasons (allegedly), it would be strange to have only one. I could not imagine a tropical paradise. For me, it would be anything but. The natural seasons help me to understand the passage of time and teach me something about God. He continues to renew and sustain despite the apparent length of winter. The Church seasons accompany what I see in nature. As we come into a sanctuary adorned in purple, we remember Jesus the King, crowned with thorns on the cross. Royal? Not to those who stood by, but only to us. A wooden throne? Not one we would choose for ourselves but the exact one that Jesus desired.

Lent gives way to Easter, as suffering will be removed by the resurrection. Although we may desire to remain in resurrection victory forever (which will occur in paradise), we eventually move into Pentecost. The joy of the resurrection is also a duty to our neighbor. "Paradise would be that much better with you in it, friend," we say to those around us. Pentecost, the longest season by far, shows us the importance of our duty. It will require the rest of our lives. But before long, Pentecost becomes Advent, as we anticipate both the birth of our Savior and his Second Coming in glory.

I could see a world in which we celebrate Easter only every thirty-three years, but it is not a world that I would want. Forgetful as we are, the constant reminders and celebrations are a necessary part of our journey. From the somber reflection of Lent to the joy of Easter. From the dutiful ordinariness of Pentecost to the hope of Advent, until at last our Savior comes in glory...

IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME

"While they were eating, Jesus took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is my body." Then he took the cup, gave thanks and offered it to them saying, "Drink from it, all of you. This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins." Matthew 26:26-28

On Palm Sunday evening, April 2nd, at 6:30, the congregation is cordially invited and encouraged to attend a dramatic and musical experience presented by members of our congregation, as well as members and friends of Faith Choir. We have presented this event twice in the past; once in 2013 and again in 2017. We attempted a third (and final) time in 2020, before Covid made its appearance and we were forced to shut down.

In remembrance of Me, eat this bread; In remembrance of Me, drink this wine; In remembrance of Me, pray for the time When God's own will is done.

There are several reasons for bringing back this moving event. First and foremost, the state of our country and the world is such that people heed a desire to return to Christ. Our culture and society is at odds with God's Word, and we all need to be reminded, especially, during the season of Lent, that we are poor, sinful beings. We are weak, weary and broken; crushed and separated from God.

In remembrance of Me, heal the sick; In remembrance of Me, feed the poor; In remembrance of Me, open the door And let your brother in, let Him in.


SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS

Fund Raising for Sanctuary Heating and Cooling Unit



Dear Faith Lutheran Members,

Over the years, our congregation has raised funds for many new additions, a parking lot, and other major undertakings. The Lord has always provided through your generosity to successfully close out these campaigns.


Now the time has come again. As many of you are aware, the sanctuary heating and cooling unit failed last November. A temporary fix was applied. This unit is twenty-three years old and ailing. At the December voters' meeting, approval was given to move forward with the replacement unit. The process has been started on building the new heating and cooling unit and will be completed and ready for installation within the next several months.

The total cost for the new heating and cooling unit, including removal and disposal of the current system, is \$83,280. Please pray about the amount you can contribute to this significant investment. Many hands can do great work. If 300 families contribute \$280, the project will be paid in full. Please mark your calendars for Sunday, March 19, between services. The Faith Lutheran Men's Group will be hosting a breakfast for the purpose of raising money for the new unit.

Thank you for all the support you have given Faith Lutheran over the years. We trust that together we can address this project the same way we have in the past.


