

Let's Go Worship

Let's go! Our annual theme for 2023-2024 explores the places that God leads us. Let's Go Worship, Let's Go Well, Let's Go Witness, and Let's Go Work. The movement begins as we approach God, graciously invited to come into his presence. God uplifts us and restores us, then he directs us out into the world. We share the message of Jesus crucified and risen, witnessing to his power in our lives and working on behalf of our neighbors. We will explore each step in detail over the coming months. We start with the call to worship.

"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord!" These words from Psalm 122 shape our first steps. Before we are healed, before we can share the power of God in our lives, before we understand the purpose of our work, we need God's presence. While Christ dwells in our hearts no matter our location, God's house provides unique benefits unavailable in other places. The first of these is the declaration of forgiveness. As you step into the door of God's house, you may reflect upon the time since you last came. It has, most likely, been filled with mistakes and regrets, sins and transgressions. These often burden us, so God removes them from the picture. We confess our sins and hear the proclamation that we are forgiven in Jesus' name. You can pray to God and ask his forgiveness anywhere, but you will only hear his audible answer in God's house.

Having been forgiven, God continues to bless us. We hear his Word, both stern reminders of our inadequacy as well as his gracious work on our behalf. Wherever our Scripture readings may be from, they can help to put our lives in perspective. We not only hear from God's word, we also understand more fully what one of those passages mean. The sermon explores both what the passage says as well as how it informs our lives. You receive direction for the coming steps.

But God is not done. While God is the main actor during worship, uplifting us and blessing us, we also act with boldness in his presence. We pray, bringing the requests of our hearts to God. You can (and should) pray in many places. The prayers of God's house collect our thoughts, especially as we lift up certain people who have asked for our prayers. While they are not more effective for having been spoken in worship, we join collectively in praying together.

God has a parting gift to provide. We approach the altar to receive the body and blood of his Son. This food of heaven is another blessing that God gives in his house. You leave worship with a clean conscience, a growing knowledge and love of God, and an uplifted spirit ready to face the trials and difficulties of life. As you are beaten and broken by the coming week, you have another opportunity to say: Let's go worship!

In the next few months, we will see the steps where God leads us. Let's go well provides the pivot point, as God heals us both within his house and throughout our lives. Let's go witness, where we take the joy and blessings that God has given to us as encouragement that our neighbors should trust in Jesus. Then lastly, let's go work, where we see the ways that we join together to help accomplish the work of God's kingdom. I hope to see you in worship!

ALL THINGS NEW AGAIN

"I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing." John 15:5

At the time of this writing, I have lost my father. Dad passed away peacefully about a week ago. It wasn't unexpected. However, I didn't expect it would happen when I was with my brother in our hometown. God's hand was at work, and I am so thankful I could be with Dad his last days and tell him I loved him. At age 97, it's still a loss, and now I'm an "orphan." Both of my folks are gone, and I have "lost" my home base.

O blessed spring, where Word and sign embrace us into Christ the Vine; Here Christ enjoins each one to be a branch of this life-giving Tree.

One could say Dad was a man for all seasons. He was a man who could be counted on in all situations; relied upon through all of life's challenges; and ready to cope with any chance event or unexpected change. Yet, he remained faithful to the One who gave him life and is all good, all love, and all mercy.

Through summer heat of youthful years, uncertain faith, rebellious tears, Sustained by Christ's infusing rain, the boughs will shout for joy again.

Dad's beginnings were extremely humble. He was born on the family farm and raised with four siblings during the Great Depression. All five were taught the value of hard work, and that a living union with Christ is absolutely necessary. For a man with a ninth- grade education, he managed to own and operate three different businesses over approximately 60 years, and became a registered Emergency Medical Technician.

When autumn cools and youth is cold, when limbs their heavy harvest hold, Then through us, warm, the Christ will move with gifts of beauty, wisdom, love.

Dad was completely selfless, honest, and faithful. He put in long days to support his family, and put my brother and me through college. He always had time to help a neighbor or a friend, and if something was needed at church, he was there. He was willing to sacrifice what the world considers precious; much of what is materialistic, foolish, and false. Yet, he was happy, always grateful, and felt richly blest.

As winter comes, as winters must, we breathe our last, return to dust, Still held in Christ, our souls take wing and trust the promise of the spring.

Faith was important to Dad. When I was a kid, he read aloud "Little visits With God" before our bedtime every night and prayed with us. Every Saturday night he would hand me a thin, silver dime for my Sunday School envelope. He attended Bible Study – always learning – until he moved to the nursing home. He was an usher, a member of the Men's Club and the choir – always serving on some board or committee. One time Dad had been in the hospital for a procedure. I went back home to help Mom out. On the day he was discharged from the hospital, he made the announce-

ment at the supper table that he thought he'd go to choir practice that evening. He didn't do it to impress his director daughter. It was something that was important to him. Another time my brother complained that the folks had delayed a weekend trip to visit them in the Twin Cities because "there's no one

to ring the bell on Sunday morning." And then there was the day following a snowstorm where my 80 year-old father was seen shoveling snow up on the pitched church roof.

Christ, holy Vine, Christ, living Tree, be praised for this blest mystery: That Word and water thus revive and join us to Your Tree of Life.

At every point in our journey through life, God meets us where we are, regardless of the season, giving us New Hope. The day Dad passed beyond this world was a New Day, where he embarked on a New Journey towards a New Life with his Creator.



Forever Young is a group of 55 and older, retired or semi-retired folks who get together the third Thursday of each month for fellowship and great food. Please join us!





Men's Fellowship
